CHANGES ARE ASKED IN GAME STATUTES

Proposed fish law changes include opening the bass season through the year save in the spawning season. At present the season is open from June 15 to December 31 which does not permit bass fishing at the best time for game fish and good eating. The new season would make the closed season extend from May 1 to July 1 only. Open season all year round has been advocated for sunfish, crappies and catfish. No suggestion as yet has been received for laws on the striped bass, a salt water fish and a new comer to Oregon which during the last year has been caught commercially in Coos county. Another suggestion advocates the prohibition of the use of clams for crab bait, it being maintained that cormorants, fish eating birds, commonly known as shags, may be used for good crab bait. In all probability a bill to prohibit the commercial canning of clams will be introduced into the legislature. Razor clams have been practically exterminated by the canning companies, the game warden said.

DEMPESEY TO TRAIN FOR TUNNEY FIGHT

Champion Not Perturbed by Squabble Over Where Match Will Be Held

DENVER, Colo., July 31.—(By Associated Press.)—Unperturbed by injunction proceedings brought by B. E. Clements of the Chicago Coliseum club to halt his match with Gene Tunney, Jack Dempsey today declared that court action would not interfere with his training for the Tunney bout and that he would leave for Saratoga Springs, N. Y., tomorrow. The whole thing is an effort to shake me down," the champion said at his training camp at Colorado Springs today, "and I am not in the least disturbed. My attorney here will handle the entire matter. Interest in the Clements' injunction proceedings, filed in federal court here yesterday by former United States district attorney Granby Hillyer, centered about a copy of what purports to be an agreement by Dempsey to be an agreement by Dempsey to the transfer of his contract with Floyd Fitzsimmons to fight Harry Wills at the Chicago Coliseum club, providing that the club has until August 5, 1926, to pay the champion \$300,000 and which was attached to the Clements' application for a temporary injunction. The agreement further provides that an additional \$500,000 must be paid the champion ten days prior to his fight with Wills and bears the champion's signature dated at Chicago March 3, 1926.

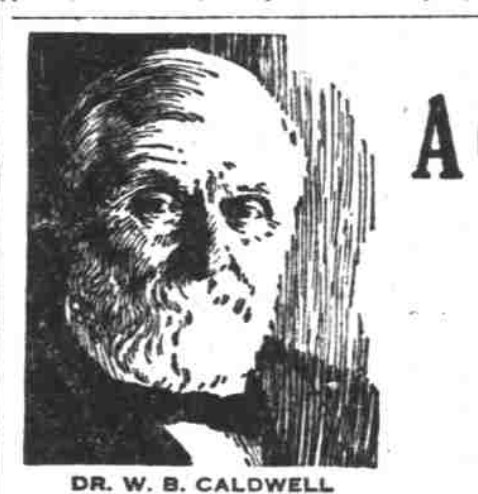


