mine quickly and accurately whether a person is coming down with it and if so, antitoxin given early will cure practically every case.

These are cold, hard facts, not theories. When we consider that not only death, but expense and inconvenience from illness are involved if the disease is permitted to go on, it can be seen that diphtheria is an economic as well as a social problem.

An overwhelming percentage of diphtheria cases take children under 10 years old, so it should take no great persuasion for Marion county to do everything humanly possible to protect these children, even if the adults take chances with themselves. Already this year 31 cases have been reported and 10 have died.

"The Marion county health unit is beginning a study of the problem in its relation to the whole county, and plans to conduct an educational campaign to put the facts before every one. Later in the year a concerted effort will be made to begin a movement for freeing the county of this menace."

"In the meantime, may I say that every sore throat, especially in children, should be considered guilty until it is proven innocent."

The largest number of deaths from diphtheria occur in spring, with the smallest number in the summer months.

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SAY GAINES IS NOT KILLER OF DAUGHTER

show a motive for the killing, was inadmissible at this time. Colvin had proposed to offer testimony intended to prove that the girl's death resulted from resistance to attentions forced upon her by her father.

After several hours' re-alignment of his case, Colvin announced that his first witness will be Dr. Dudley Tong, a physician who treated Mrs. Elizabeth Gaines, the defendant's wife, November 30, for self-inflicted gun-shot wounds.

Cyrus E. Jones, a neighbor of Gaines, who reported quarrels between Sylvia and her father, was listed next. George Memmer and his wife and Mrs. Etta McAuliff, neighbors of the accused man, follow Jones.

In barring the motive evidence, Judge Jones said:

"The whole thing resolves itself down to the question of what is relevant. It is quite clear to me that there must be some causal connection establishing or tending to establish a motive or impulse or some force that would lead to that result before introduction of what would be a wholly collateral affair. But there is no force of the state of his right of sustaining any testimony on the showing of any set of facts tending to bridge the gap between the motive and the crime."

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STATE LIME PLANT BECOMING ACTIVE

Terms to Be Allowed on Buying Lime, and 2 Per Cent Discount for Cash

The season for activity in the state lime plant at the penitentiary is approaching. Lime may be put onto the land at any time, but during the busy harvest days the farmers have little opportunity to attend to this detail. President Moore of the state lime board and Mr. Gilbert, one of the members of the board, were in Salem yesterday checking up on the operations of the plant. They met with Governor Pierce at the prison at noon.

They agreed that the present prices, \$4.75 a ton for loose lime at the penitentiary, and \$5.50 for sacked lime, are about right. It costs \$1.25 a ton for the lime at the quarry near Gold Hill, and \$2.05 a ton for freight. There is a loss in the grinding at the prison, some lime goes off in dust, and the same thing happens in handling and shipping.

The present prices make the farmers of the Salem district a saving of around \$1.50 a ton under what it was costing them from the plant when operated at Gold Hill. The lime turned out there was only about 78 per cent pure. It is about 98 per cent pure as turned out at the prison; guaranteed, 96 per cent pure.

And counting the handling of the worse than worthless percentage, and the freight on it, this, too, makes a saving that is estimated at around \$2 a ton.

It is hoped that there may be secured from the Southern Pacific a lower freight rate, both on the lime rock coming in and the agricultural lime going out. In that case, the saving will all be passed on to the farmers.

Printed matter is to be prepared giving the uses and benefits of agricultural lime.

The cash buyers are to be allowed 2 per cent, and farmers who desire it are to be given four months in which to pay. Those not paying in four months are to be charged 6 per cent interest after the expiration of that time.

A car load of lime was sent from the plant to Tillamook yesterday, and more lime rock is on the way from the quarry. It is likely that the capacity of the plant, 50 tons a day, will soon be taxed to keep up with the orders.

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SINKING FUND MADE FOR FRENCH NATION

Tumultuous Scene Witnessed By Assembly When Measure Is Adopted

VERSAILLES, France, Aug. 10.—(By Associated Press.)—Mid the most tumultuous scenes ever witnessed in the national assembly, that body made up of the chamber of deputies and the senate in joint session late this evening endorsed France with a sinking fund having sound constitutional basis.

This sinking fund had to be incorporated into the organic law of the national assembly was necessary. The fund will be used to effect a mortgaging of the country's floating debt, and is one of the schemes with which the government hopes to relieve the tangled financial situation.
