

OBTAINING LICENSE IS MERE FORMALITY

Final Arrangements for Bout on Sept. 16 Will Be Completed Today

NEW YORK, Aug. 10.—(By the Associated Press.)—Jack Dempsey will defend his world heavy-weight title against Gene Tunney in a 15-round match at the Yankee stadium on Sept. 16, just as Tex Rickard has planned, providing the champion survives one more round of his technical tussle with the state boxing authorities.

There was every indication today that Dempsey would go the remaining distance successfully after the Health committee of the state athletic commission, reaching the critical stage of this legal fray in a hectic session, had "deferred" the champion's application for a license, but also left the way clear for him to obtain the necessary permit by complying with certain rules and regulations.

The refusal of the commission to act today on the champion's license at first looked as a distinct setback, but explanation of its decision by the license committee chairman, Col. John J. Phelps, afterwards made it clear that only technicalities of arranging contracts stand in the way of issuing Dempsey's permit.

Tunney, making a similar application at the same time, was granted a license. The committee also agreed to permit the champion's business representatives to act as a second.

Stripped of its technical elements the license committee's action means that Dempsey will be granted a license as soon as the formal contracts for a bout with Tunney are prepared in accordance with the commission's rules and regulations and submitted for approval.

Since the commission by a two to one vote already has gone on record as favoring the match, this will be only a formality.

Today Tex Rickard had the necessary papers prepared and signed by Tunney. Since Dempsey is not yet licensed, he cannot attach his signature to them until the entire matter may be consummated tomorrow at a special session of these official bodies, both of which are understood to be ready to act quickly to clear up the situation and permit arrangements for the fight to go ahead.

Today's developments, while they ended in the apparent certain prospect that the title battle will be held here, passed through a series of dramatic, and at times confusing stages during deliberations that lasted for three hours in the office of the athletic commission, alternating thrusting Dempsey, Tunney and Harry Willis into the limelight.
