Judge Wilson was elected as a congressman from Ore gon in 1872, but was called by death in the east before he took his seat in the national legislature.
The house which he had built was later converted into a telrje. many years it was known as the Salem hotel. As time went on and modern hotels were built, this buildin the city's more modest homes for transients.
