PORTLAND EXPORTS **BIG IN SEPTEMBER**

Portland, Oct. 16 .- (Special) -Exports for the month of Sepember reached a total of 234,716 ons, with a valuation of over nine and one-half million dollars, which is not only a record month for the calender year 1926, but evidently has broken all previous records, according to a report issued by the Traffic department, The Port of Portland commission.

The outstanding feature of the month's business was the movement of wheat, which reached a total of ,786,208 bushels, with a lots destined for 12 different countries.

Flour exports were also larger than any previous month during the present year, totaling 73,399 barrels, with a value of \$426,026, shipment being made to the following countries: United Kingdom, 357 1/2 bbls.; Holland, 3,665 bbls.; Salvador, 7,169 1/2 bbls.; Guatemala, 1,026 bbls.; Mexico, 520 bbls.; Colombia, 233 bbls.; Equador, 5.150 bbls.; Peru, 904 bbls.; Philippine Islands, 17,875 bbls.; Japan, 250 bbls., and China,

36,250 bbls. Export lumber shipments for the month totaled 26,244 feet, with a value of \$594,485, which is a fair month's business, although somewhat less than the month of August, during which time a total of 33,288 feet valued at \$753,043

was moved. A large increase was shown in he average movement of canned during the month of September. amounted to 3,573,343 lbs., as against 1,610,596 lbs., during August, an increase of 1,962,747 lbs., or 21 per cent.
