INDIAN PRINCE PLANS TRIP TO UNITED STATES

(Continued from page 1.) and boasts family supremacy since 1470. He is entitled to be addressed as "Your Highness" and to a salute of 11 guns when approaching any possession of the British empire.

"Except for a British agent who resides in those Indian states, the Rajpoots have unrestricted power over their subjects. Through tribute to neighboring states his domain is protected, and protective forces within the borders of Rajpootia apparently are unnecessary, considering the size of its army which consists of 111 men."

"Two native tribes—the Bhils (bowmen) and the Kols—make up the greater portion of the population of Rajpootia. The Bhils once were in power in India. Under the rule of the Moguls they were submissive and occupied the lowlands, but other tribes treated them so cruelly that they rebelled and fled to the hills, whence few of them returned. They used the bow to defend the mountain fast-

nesses and rebel invaders. In 1818 the British tried to subdue them without success. In 1825, through the use of milder methods, a British agency was established in the state. In many of the central Indian states the princes, on succession, have their foreheads marked with blood from the thumb or toe of a Bhil. They believe that this is a mark of Bhil allegiance, but it is more probably a relic of days when the tribe was in power in India. They have binding oaths. The most sacred is that sworn by the dog, the Bhil praying that the curse of a dog may fall upon him if he breaks his word.

"For centuries Hanuman, the monkey god, has been the chief divinity of these people. Offerings are also made to the much-feared goddess of smallpox, and stone worship is still found among them. Many have become Moslems and Hindus."

WOMEN CRITICIZE ACTION OF BOARD

Silverton City Council Hear Protests of Residents Near School

SILVERTON, Oct. 9.—(Special to The Statesman).—At a recent meeting of the city council Mrs. E. M. Hicks and Mrs. Daisy Woods were present and protested against the action of the school board for erecting cement posts and closing Park street from Water to First during school hours.

Both Mrs. Hicks and Mrs. Woods have property adjoining this block while it is the only outlet to the Woods home. The women declared that to close this street during any hours of the day would greatly inconvenience them in their going and coming from their homes. They called attention to the fact that a large play shed had recently been built and that the entire court back of the Eugene Field building was used for play ground; and that this should give the children ample room for playing without utilizing the streets.

The council read and discussed the petition presented by the school board in regard to this matter, reaching the decision that council members had no authority to act in the matter.

Negro Slave Marriages Recognized by Bureau

WASHINGTON.—(AP)—Slave marriages among the negroes of the south finally have been recognized by the pension bureau.

The case was that of Cinthy E. Brown, now living at St. Paul, Minn., the widow of Mathew Brown, a slave, who after he was freed enlisted with the Douglas Independent Battery U. S. Colored Light Artillery.

The Browns were married before freedom, according to the slave custom. They were married again after the war.

The pension bureau had the record of that marriage. It at first declined to allow the widow an increase of pension from \$30 a month to \$50 a month.

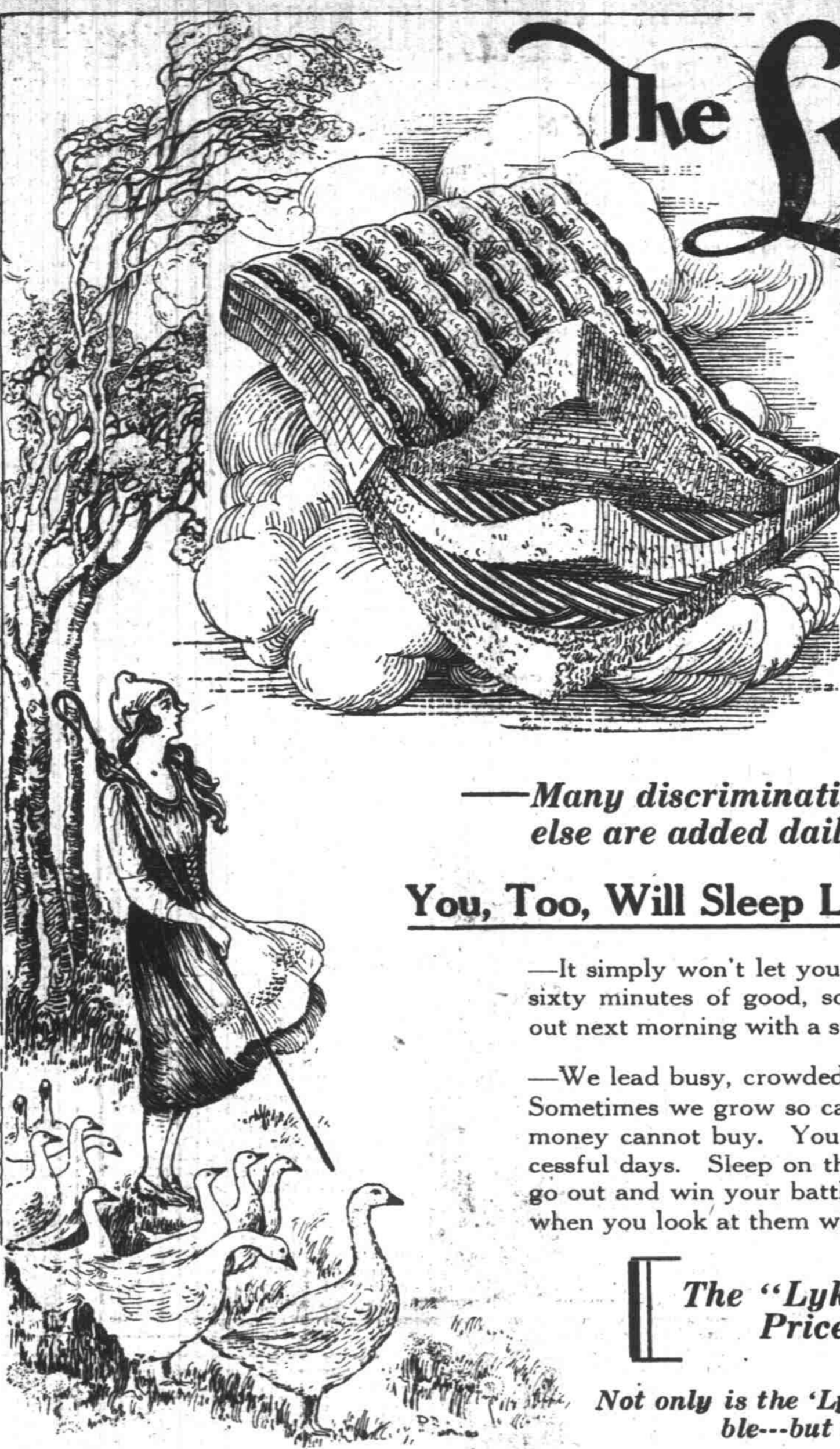
After the letter explaining the earlier slave marriage, the increase was allowed.
