
There are proposals on the November ballot for two more rmal schools, one at some point in eastern Oregon, and the other at Seaside

Oregon has a new normal school at Ashland, authorized by the legislature at its last session. It is not interfering with the attendance of the normal school at Monmouth, which, however, is operating at a disadvantage due to its small appropriation.

There are sound arguments in favor of a third normal school in eastern Oregon, and one should be established, if the state can afford it-




