### Group Feels No Right for Giving City Property as Market Place

The future policy of the city zoning and planning commission will be to refuse to recommend installation of gasoline curb pumps. it was indicated last night at the commission's meeting, when the application of the Capitol Motors company for two such pumps was considered.

The application was granted. with the condition that no precedent was being set, and that the commission was not in accord with the practice. It was felt that since other such pumps had recently been granted, the commission could not in fairness turn down this application.

Reason for this opinion, as stated by Louis Campbell, chairman of the commission, is that it is not right to grant the city property for selling gasoline any more than it is for selling vege-tables, groceries, or any other merchandise.


