A Christmas dinner will be served with roast goose, cranberries, mince pie, candy, nuts and oranges. Mr. Howard made the remark that the inmates of the blind school are more fortunate than those of some other state institutions, in being able to go to their homes for Christmas as this privilege is denied many.
