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University, Colleges and Schools Draw Many New Families to Salem

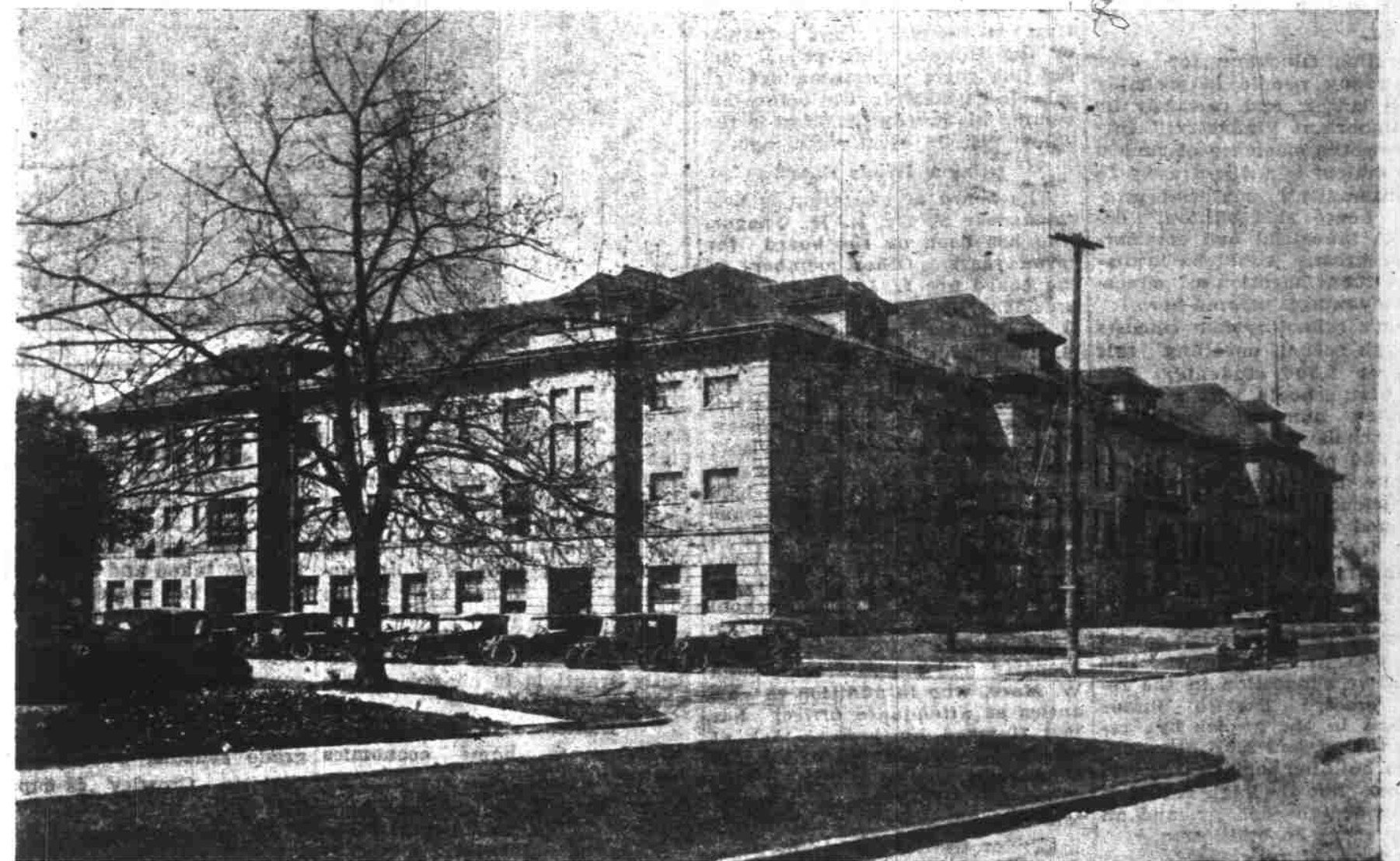

WILLAMETTE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS



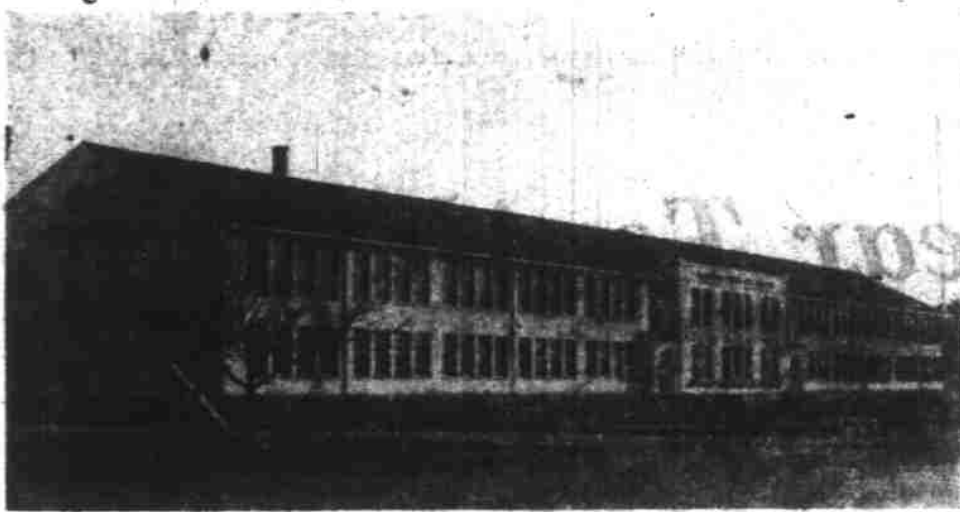
Established in 1843 by missionaries of the Methodist-Episcopal church, Willamette University was in reality the nucleus about which Salem was built. Today the university has modern buildings, an exceptional faculty, enrollment of 540 in regular term and large summer school attendance. In addition to the school of liberal arts, the university offers work in law leading to a degree, and special music courses. Kimball School of Theology is located on the same campus.

SACRED HEART ACADEMY



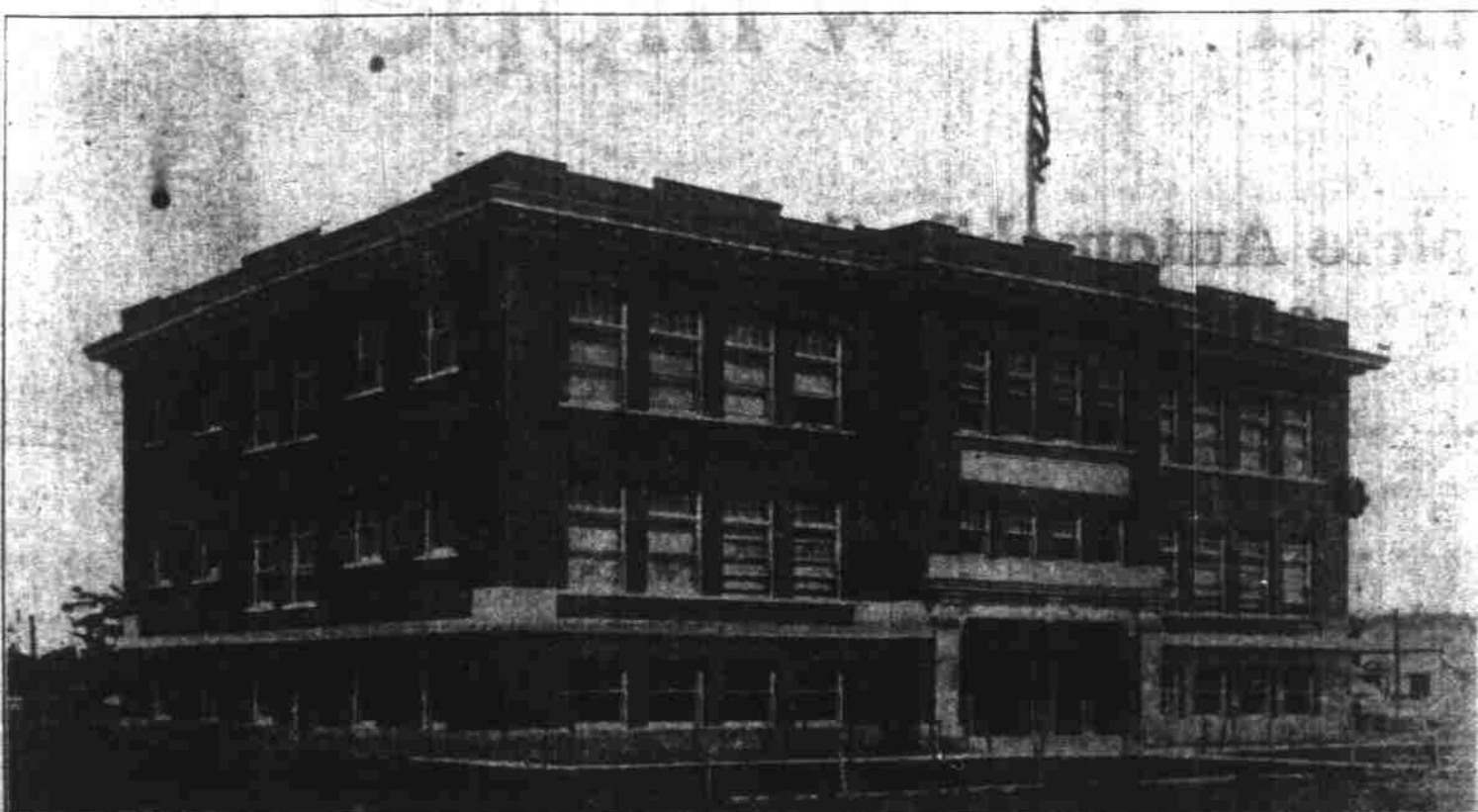
Well equipped school for girls.
