SOUTH BEND, Ind.—(Special)  
Detailed sales reports, just received by the Studebaker factory from Paris, show that the first Erskine Six to be sold was purchased by Edwin V. Morgan, American ambassador to Brazil. Ambassador Morgan was in Paris at the time of the Automobile Salon where the Erskine Six, Studebaker's new 2-1/2 litre car, was first shown. He was so impressed with the design of the car that he placed the initial order. Delivery of his car will be made in Brazil. The new Erskine Six will make its debut in America at the New York Automobile Show, January 8-15.

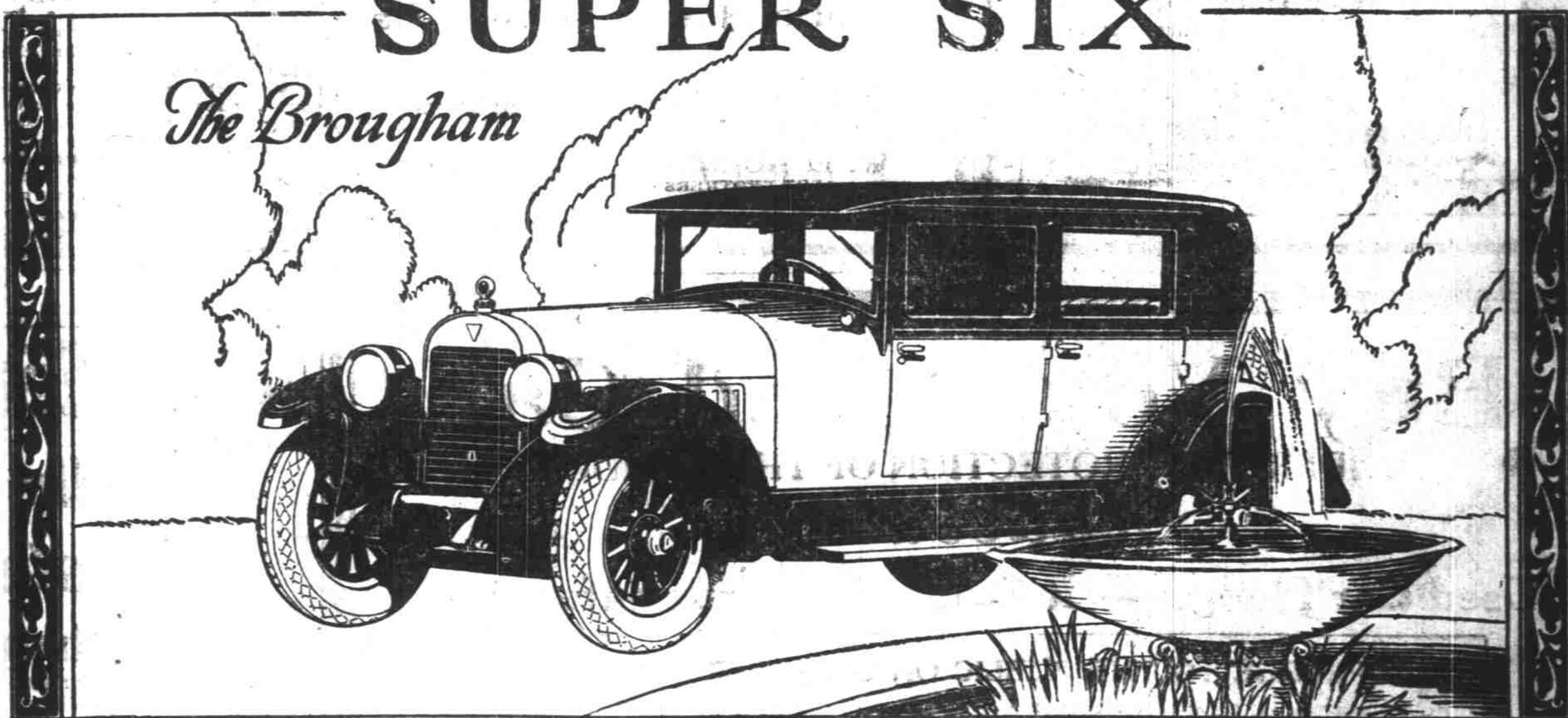

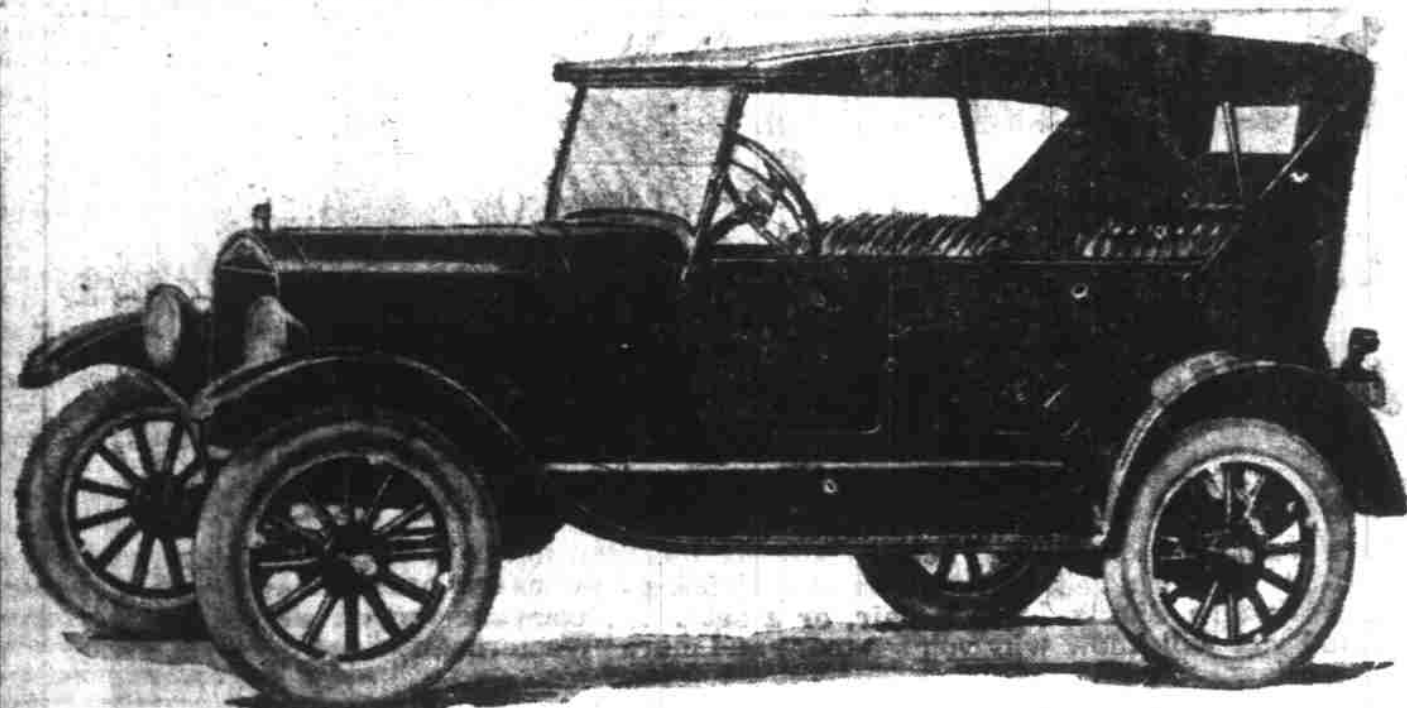
