

MULTNOMAH COUNTY LEADS IN PAYMENTS

Clackamas Comes Second, Marion Shows Gain for 1927 of \$10,844.63

Multnomah county, with the highest property assessment values in the state, will pay \$2,702,567.75 of the total state tax for the year 1927, according to a statement issued here today by Earl Fisher, state tax commissioner. Multnomah county's proportion of the state tax in 1926 was \$2,559,405.69.

Clackamas county is second in the state with its proportion of the total state tax fixed at \$340,377.42. Clackamas county's proportion of the 1926 state tax was \$326,939.32. Lane county's proportion of the state tax which in 1926 was \$306,849 has been increased for the year 1927 to \$328,571.53.

Mrs. Julia H. Tibbits Passes Away at Her Home

Mrs. Julia H. Tibbits, who passed away at her home in this city Thursday evening, December 30, was born in Syracuse, N. Y., March 5, 1868, and was at the time of her death 58 years, 9 months and 5 days of age. She was the daughter of John H. and Sophie Nubbers Mische, who were early settlers in the section of Syracuse in which they made their home. Mrs. Tibbits' early life was spent as a professional nurse; and in her work she ministered to the comfort of many of the prominent families of her native city; as well as to many of the poor to whom she gave her time and sympathetic help without stint. On January 30, 1901, she was married to J. C. Tibbits; and together they went to live at Trumansburg, N. Y., where Mr. Tibbits became pastor of the Baptist church. After four years spent at Trumansburg and two years at Utica; they located at Chester, Conn., where Mr. Tibbits was for three years pastor of the Baptist church. In 1910 they came west and located at Ipswich, S. D.; and in 1912 to Oregon. Since 1918, they have made their home in Salem. Here Mrs. Tibbits has endeared herself to her friends and neighbors by her cheerful disposition and spirit of helpfulness. She will be greatly missed by her friends. She leaves to mourn her passing, besides her husband, three children, Ruth E., a graduate of the Los Angeles Bible institute and at present employed in the office of the state highway department; Edgar A., a public accountant employed by Lybrand, Ross Brothers and Montgomery, Portland; and Nellie E. Tibbits, a recent graduate of the Salem high school. The funeral service will be held from the Terwilliger funeral parlors Monday morning at 10:30 o'clock with concluding services at the Portland crematorium at 2:30 p. m. Final interment will be in the east at the convenience of the family.

Tradition was closely followed today and promptly at 11 o'clock marine corps trumpeters, in vivid scarlet and blue dress uniforms, sounded a flourish to announce that the president and Mrs. Coolidge were about to descend the state stairway and enter the blue room. The marine band orchestra stationed in the foyer, played "Hail to the Chief," as they came down the stairs, accompanied by members of the cabinet and their wives, whom they had greeted in the library on the second floor.

The first to pass along the receiving line were foreign diplomats, headed by Baron de Cartier de Marchienne, the Belgian ambassador, who is dean of the diplomatic corps. The representatives of foreign governments, who later attended a breakfast tendered them at the Pan-American Union by Secretary and Mrs. Kellogg, were in full diplomatic uniform, some embroidered in gold upon black cloth with swords at the side, some with colored coats and astrakhan collars and Russian boots, others in still different habits traditional in the countries which they represent here.

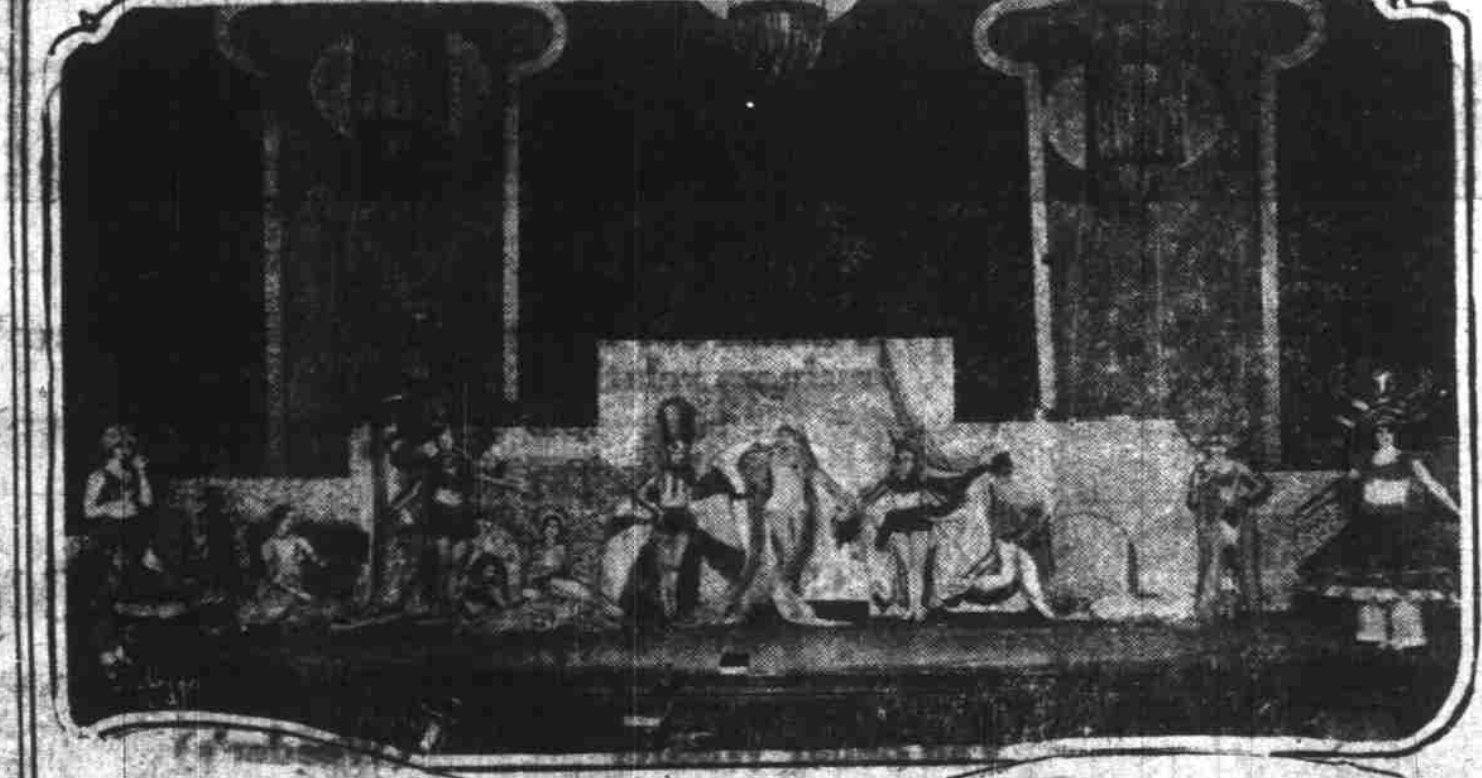

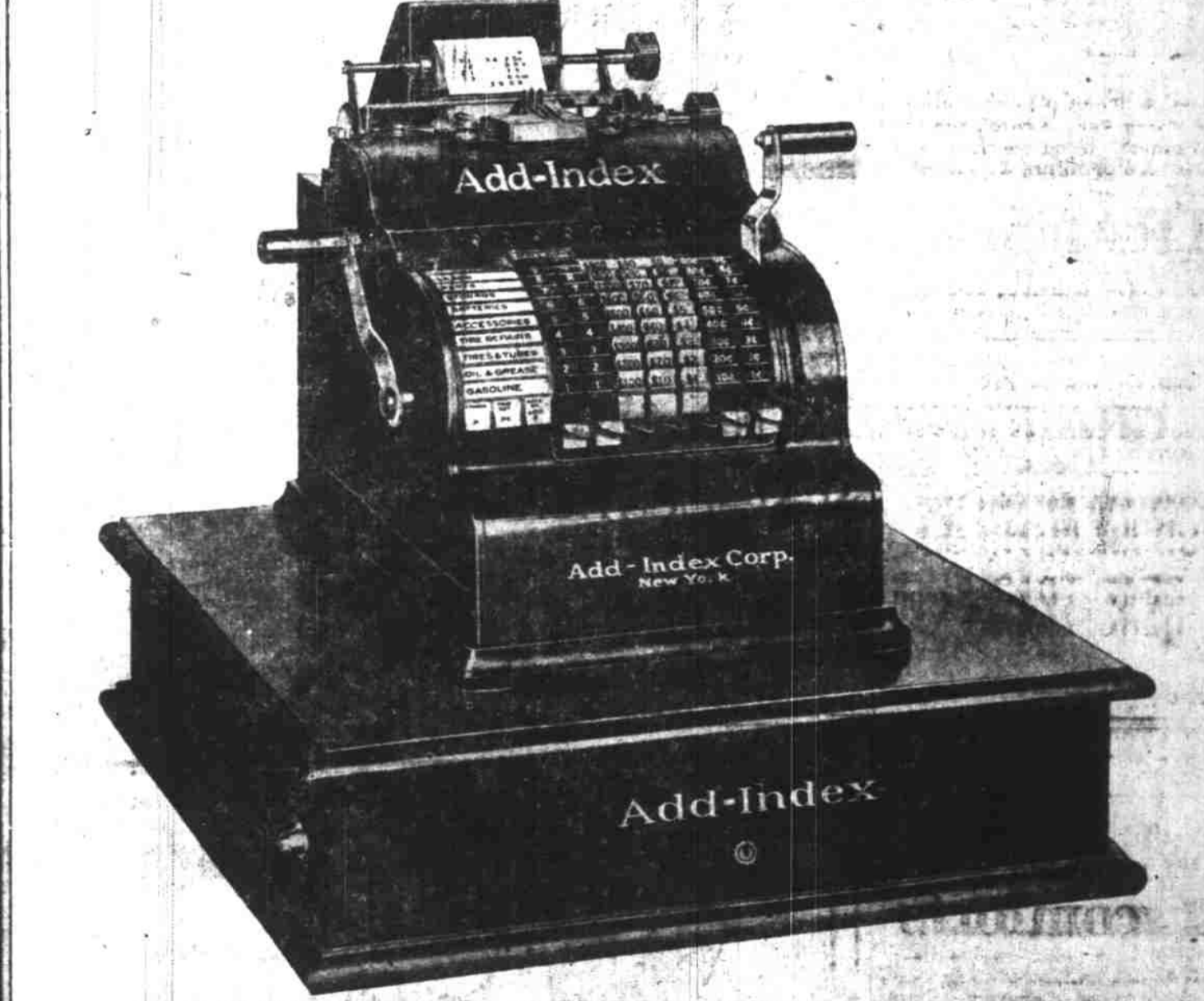
