

Famous Juvenile Judge's Election in 1924 Held Illegal by Court

DENVER, Colorado, Jan. 24,-(AP)-Ruling his re-election in 1924 illegal, the Colorado supreme court today ordered Ben B. Lindsey ousted as judge of the Denver juvenile court where he has served a quarter of a century.

The noted judge however, declared himself one not to be removed so easily and took the posi- sor. tion that he would continue in office until the next general election produces a qualified successor. In the opinion of others, the effect of the court's action will be to leave the office vacant until filled by appointment of the county commissioners.

"I'll fight to the bitter end." Judge Lindsey told the Associated Press, "The decision is the most astounding thing I ever heard."

The high court, by a three-totwo vote, with one justice not participating, granted an ouster sought by Mrs. Royal R. Graham, widow of Judge Lindsey's opponent in 1924, on the ground that the election proceedings in one precinct of Denver revealed "a most regrettable and astounding condition." In this district the vôte was Lindsey 548; Graham 15. The supreme court said that "the whole conduct of the judges and clerks of election in that precinct show a gross negligence and total store, 189 N. Commercial. disregard of their official duties."
