WASHINGTON, Jan. (AP)-Army engineers' recommendations on the Longy bridge bill were transmitted today to the secretary of war by Major General Jadwin. Secretary Davis will take the bill and the engineers' conclusions to the White House tomorrow or as so afterwards as possible.

Indications were that the engineers found the bill objectionable, but that Secretary Davis, while advising the president of their attitude, will not suggest that the bill be vetoed. The chief objection of the engineers is understood to be directed against the provision giving the departments of commerce and agriculture a voice in bridge construction decisions, which previously had been the function of army engineers.
