

# Double Header Basketball Scheduled For Tonight in W. U. Gymnasium

## SEACAT QUINSET TO MEET OREGON

High and University freshmen Scheduled to Meet in Opener

Additional seats were being added into the Willamette university gymnasium Tuesday afternoon in anticipation of a record-breaking crowd for tonight's double-header, when the Willamette Bearcats meet the unsurpassed Seacat quintet of Oregon basketball and Salem high takes on the Oregon freshman quintet. The game will start at 7:15 p. m. Coach Spec Keene of Willamette announced after Tuesday's practice that he would start the team that opened both games last week, with the exception that he was planning to "Shadder" Riedel, lanky forward, so that he might be fresh for the game with College of Puget Sound later in the week. Her or Minto will probably be in Riedel's place. This is not expected to weaken the team especially, as either of these men is to the general standard of the Oregon will have in action the men who have been leading the state which has rolled up 755 points in 18 games, an average of 42 points to the game, so far this season, and that is expected to be the conference championship this year. These men, Okerberg, Williams, Weisen and Gunther, all made the state high school team at some time before entering the university.

## LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL CONTINUES TO WIN

Same Fast Pace Set Which Spelled Defeat for Many Other Teams

The same fast breaking offense that has spelled ruin for all previous opponents, worked to Salem high school's advantage again Tuesday evening, and resulted in victory over Albany high, 43 to 17.

It was well that the speed of Salem's attack was not lessened by the absence of Duffey, for Albany sent on the floor a team just as fast and aggressive as Salem's, and lacking in only two respects—size and offensive coordination.

The usual course of events on the Salem high floor was departed from radically when Albany jumped into the lead at the opening of the game. The Salem high quintet really wasn't accustomed to the stubbornness with which Albany fought for the ball, and before they settled down, the visitors had scored two well earned field goals.

Then the "three horsemen," with Ashby in as one of them instead of Duffey, started their habitual series of dashes down the floor before the defense could form, and the visitors' small lead quickly melted.

But their fight remained in evidence, and Salem high had to earn a majority of its points. Stone and McClain, Albany's guards, had an uneasy knack of getting between that ball and its goal, whether it was a Salem player or the basket; and their advance back up the floor was equally impressive. But fastness carried far enough to insure a score, and the half ended 18 to 4 in Salem's favor.

In the second half, the visitors started out with another speedy rally that netted five points before Salem could get started. These spectacular dashes at the opening of each half, in fact, led to a suspicion that the Albany youths would be fully Salem's equal if they could maintain the pace.

But it seemed they couldn't, so the Salemites started in creating statistics again, and didn't slow down even when three new men were substituted.

## CATALINA CHANNEL CONQUERED AGAIN

Henry F. Sullivan Conceded Victory Over Long Stretch of Water

LONG BEACH, Cal., Feb. 1.—(AP)—With the distinction of being the second man and the first American to swim the Catalina channel generally conceded to be his, Henry F. Sullivan, of Lowell, Mass., was recuperating at a bath establishment here tonight from the effects of his struggle with the chilly waters of the Pacific ocean.

Sullivan, who has a crossing of the English channel to his credit as well as a number of other nautical records and who was an unsuccessful entrant in the Wrigley \$25,000 contest Jan. 15, touched shore at Point Vicente at seven minutes before midnight last night, completing the channel swim in 22 hours and 45 minutes.

Starting from a point north of the isthmus on Catalina island at 1:30 a. m. Sunday, Sullivan swam steadily, but slowly, to the same point where George Young, youthful Canadian, finished his spectacular swim two weeks ago.

Sullivan's successful completion of the swim was attested to by John J. Conlon, his trainer and manager; Irving David, pilot; E. F. Chase, a Salt Lake City photographer; Jack Swain, a Long Beach newspaperman and a number of others.

The same help bed that almost blocked Young's way at the finish of his swim proved a severe obstacle to Sullivan. Outgoing tides, too, slowed up his time, he said today. At the finish only a small boat containing Conlon and David was able to come in shore, the other boats conveying the swimmer being forced to remain 500 feet off shore and outside the help bed.

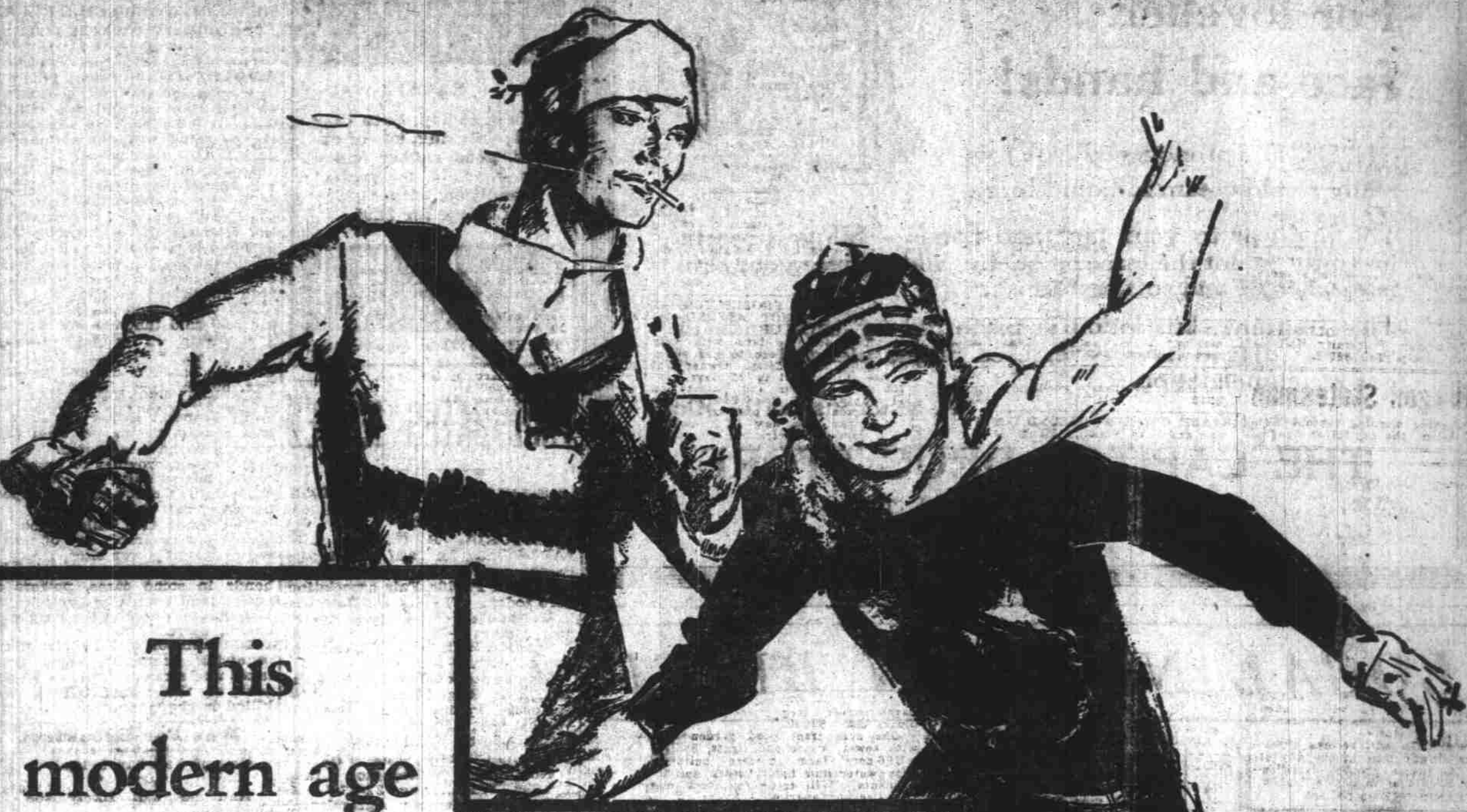
His unwillingness to acknowledge defeat caused Sullivan to attempt a second swim of the channel, his trainer said. What his plans for the future are, the trainer could not say.
