## Symphony Orchestra Will Give Numbers Heard in Salem at Portland Concert

The popular concert of the Portland Symphony orchestra, to be given at The Auditorium Saturday morning will feature one of the most successful of comparatively modern musical compositions presented in this city in recent years. It is the symphonic poem of the Russian composer Modest Mousorgsky, "A Night on Bald Mountain." This, with modern composition that, with Rimsky-Korsakov's "Flight of the Bumble-Bee," created a sensation in Salem Monday night, during the symphony concert there.

The concert will open with the Mozart serenade, "Eline Kleine Nachtmusik," considered one of the most perfect orchestra pieces handed down from the 18th century. It was presented by the symphony for the first time earlier this season. It is written in four movements, and may be regarded as a miniature symphony.

The most brilliant piece on the program will be the fantasy of Chabrier "Espana Rhapsodie," a glamorous composition that came from France in the last century. This work has been heard here many times, and is eminently popular. A novelty will be an orchestral arrangement of the familiar "Tramere" by Schumann.

The concert conductor, Willem van Hoogstraeten, will give short explanatory talks before each number.—Oregon Journal.

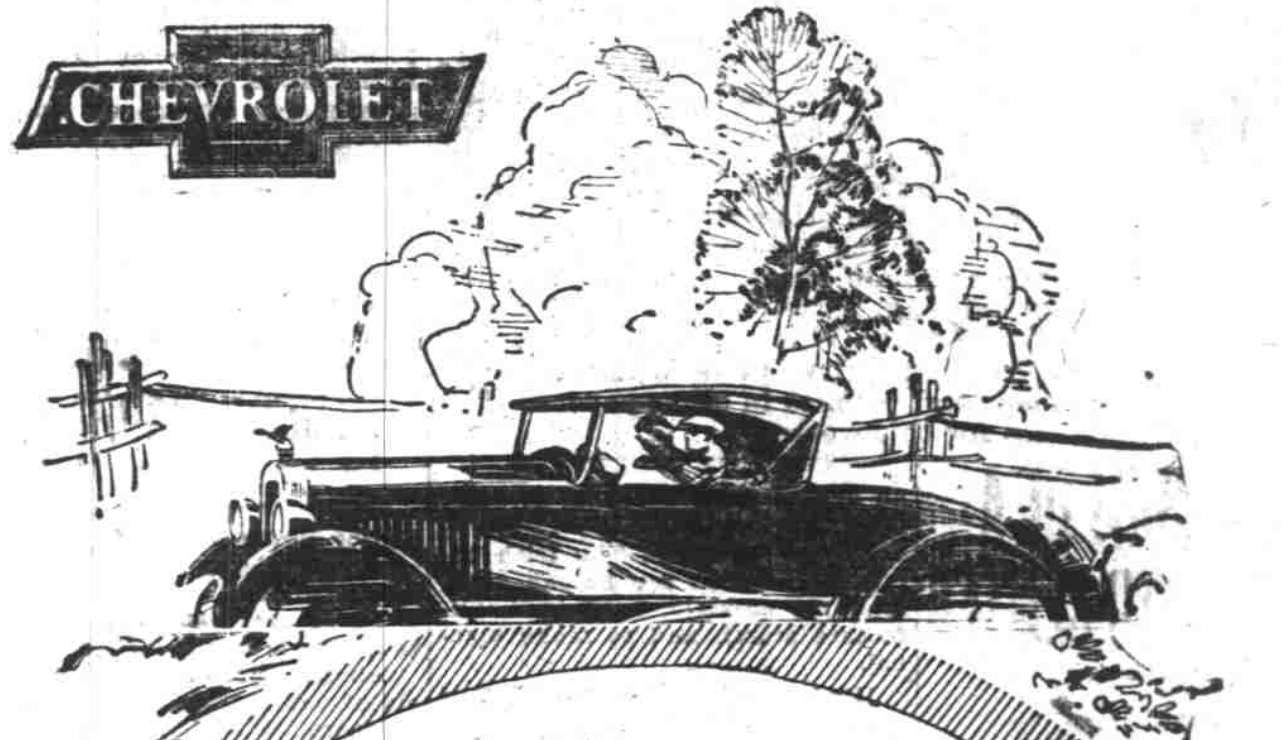
