(Special.) - Tillamook high school basketball team qualified for the state tournament here tonight by defeating Newberg 34 to 12 in the final game of the district tournament. In the afternoon Newberg, which earlier in the season had lost to McMinnville, upset the dope by winning from the local quintet 26 to 18.

PORTLAND, Mar. 5 .- (AP)-Winners and probable winners of various district basketball championships in the Oregon state high school athletic association were announced here tonight by Roy E Cannon of Gresham, Ore., secretary of the organization. He asks that all schools be represented at the state basketball titular tourney to start next Thursday at Salem send in the names and numbers of players at once either to him or to Roy S. Keene, director of physical education at Willamette university, Salem.

"There has been some controversary over the method to be adopted in making drawings to determine the order in which games shall be played and the players" said secretary Cannon, "so for that reason it has been decided to have all the entrants register. Thursday morning at the offices of the physical director of Willamette at 11:45. The drawings will then be made in accordance with the decision of the majority of those present.

"Two district championships have been definitely settled. La. Grande has won in district number 1 and Pendleton in district northwest.

"District number 3 will probably be represented either by Redmond or Wasco, district number 4. by Medford, district number 5 by Marshfield, district number six by Corvallis, Eugene or Siletz, district number 7 by Salem, district number 8 by Tillamook or Mc-Minnville, district 9 by Clatskanie
