Officials said that Wilkins probably covered up his unlawful operations over a period of years for the reason that he was well known to employes of the various store where he was sent for supplies. It was surmised by officials that upon entering these stores Wilkins would assemble the supplies consigned to the prison and at the same time pick up other articles of merchandise

Upon reaching the penitentiary the supplies were unloaded at the commissary, while the loot was taken to the institution garage and concealed in the cache Prison officials indicated that in case the persons receiving the dolen property were identified they would be prosecuted.

Pending the conclusion of the investigation Wilkins will remain in the "bull pen." He will not be allowed to mingle with other prionors, and will be 'deprived o many institution privileges.


