Blanche Reese of the Parrish junior high school has been awarded the first prize of \$3 in this contest, and Lois Birdwell of the McKinley junior high the second prize of \$2.

Another interesting activity of the art department is the quill pen on art, which has appeared each week during the winter in the local papers. In connection with this an exhibit of pictures has been placed in the windows of the U. S. National bank.

A sale of plants and cut flowers, which cleared over \$60, was one of the first things taken up by the department. This sum has been turned over to the club treasurer and will be placed in the fund for purchasing new furnishings for the club house.

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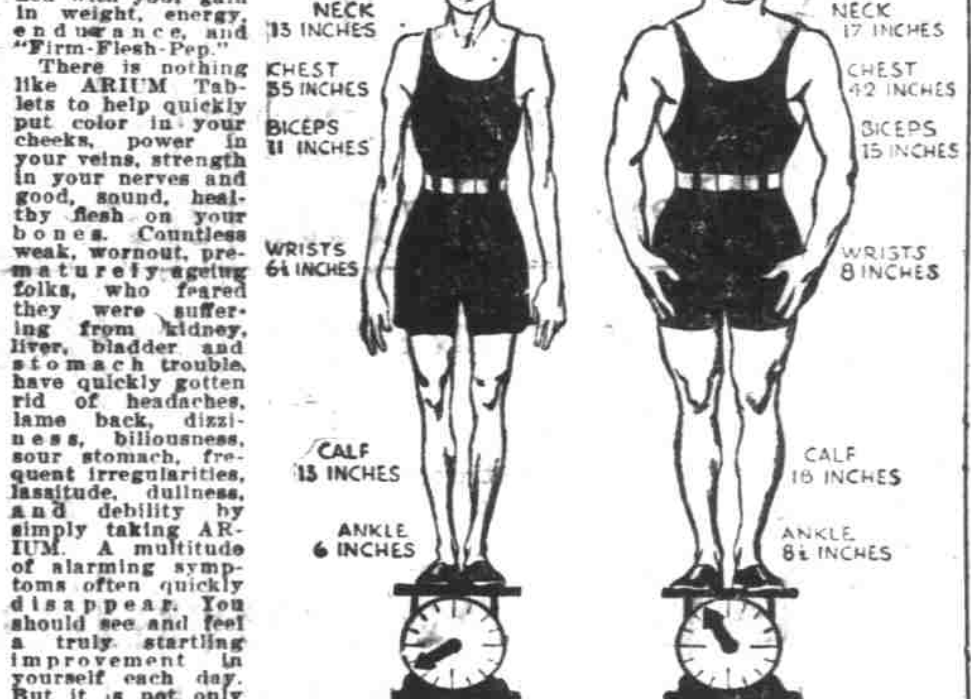
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has asked the institutions department of the Salem Woman's club to sponsor two programs during Music week.
