The order reducing interstate freight rates on farm products in Oregon was issued in the year 1924 but later was attacked by the railroads. The order was upheld by both the circuit court for Marion county and by the state supreme court.

The letter to the public service commission was signed by Ulysses Butler, chief examiner for the interstate commerce commission.
