



PROTECTION WORK Perfect Record Sheldon Enumerates - Principles of Pennsylvania

Game Commissioners H. P. Sheldon, chief United States game warden, in a leading editorial in the June issue of "Field and Stream Magazizne" comes to the defense of the Penusylvania system of game protection which has recently been ac-

trol by "sportsmen." Mr. Sheldon writes, "The significant point to be noted is this: that reliable reports that Pennsylvania was practically barren of game 40 years ago and that the once harren coverts of the state annually return to each sportsman shareholder 28 pounds of the varied game at a price not much in excess of 41/2 cents a pound. The Pennsylvania system treats game and fish conservation as a business enterprise—a practical job to be financed and supported by those who find a profit in its success."

And according to him, if the license holders were driven from the field by unreasonable restrictions and allowed no voice in the counsels of conservation the funds necessary for the enforcement of game regulations would disappear.
