APPOINTMENTS MAIN INTEREST FOR TIME

(Continued from page 1) received by the board of regents of state normal schools endorsing Mrs. Redfield for the presidency of the Oregon institution.

Although not an active applicant for the normal school presidency, R. R. Turner of Dallas, probably will be considered. Mr. Turner has served as state superintendent of public instruction and has held other offices of trust. He has been superintendent of the schools at Dallas for seven years, and recently was elected to the position for another three years' term. It was said that G. A. Bricker of Cleveland, Ohio, also would accept the normal school presidency.

To Select Commission Acting under a new law enacted at the last session of the legislature the state board of education will meet within the next few weeks and select members of the state text-book commission. The appointment of the text-book commission previously was vested in the governor, but the law was amended at the last legislative session at the request of Governor Patterson. Reports here, recently indicated that all members of the present text-book commission were slated for retirement.

Turner Considered Members of the commission are Milton Miller and Winnifred Winard of Portland, George Hug of Salem, A. C. Hampton of Astoria and F. C. Kent of Corvallis. It was said that at least two members of the state board of education would vote to reinstate R. R. Turner as a member of the text-book commission. Mr. Turner previously was a member of the commission but was removed by ex-Governor Pitcock.

state budget director by Governor Patterson is one of the administration activities that has caused considerable speculation. It is likely that this appointment will be announced within the next two weeks. Friends of Governor Patterson have indicated that the office of budget director would be offered to Sam A. Koser, secretary of state. The term would cover approximately three and one half years, with an annual salary of not less than \$6,000. This is \$600 a year more than he receives as secretary of state.

Five Men Mentioned In event the secretary of state is offered the office of budget director and accepts it his successor would be named by Governor Patterson. The names of at least five prominent men have been mentioned in connection with the appointment of secretary of state. These include Roy Ritner of Pendleton, John Cochran of Portland, Carl Gabrielson of Salem, Hal Hoss, private secretary to the governor, and A. H. Lee, ex-secretary of the Oregon state fair board.

Mr. Cochran previously served as deputy secretary of state and is now deputy internal revenue collector with headquarters in Portland. Mr. Gabrielson is in charge of the state motor vehicle department. Mr. Ritner formerly served as state senator from Umatilla county and is a close personal friend of the governor. The governor also has under consideration selection of a board of naturopath examiners which was authorized under an act of the 1927 legislature.

LIQUOR STORES POPULAR

Women Crush, Police Called to Quiet Thirsty Crowds

WINDSOR, Ont., June 4.—(AP)—Police reserves were called out today to handle the crowds that gathered at the two government liquor stores here, after several women prospective purchasers fainted in the rush incident to the opening at 10 a. m.

Long lines of persons began forming before the stores early today and at opening time the crowds had grown to such an extent as to become unmanageable. Women close to the entrance of the stores were suffocated in the crush. Practically every policeman of the local force was required to restore order, and the work required several hours. No one was seriously injured.

At closing time hundreds of persons were turned away from the stores unserved.
