GENEVA, Switzerland, June 29. -(AP)--With the British now emingly convinced that it is imsible to reopen the Washington caty, at this time, without the usent of the United States, the elegates to the tripartite naval oference are focusing their atation on the problem of cruis-This may take on a new ano owing to their emphasis on wisdom of agreeing to a retion in the caliber of the guns. Experts are examining the feaslity not only of dividing cruis-- into classes, but also the creon of two categories of 10,000 eruisers, one of which would armed with 8-inch guns, as provided by the Washington reement and the other with 6h guns.

Apparently the Americans are pressing too hard the argunt that 6-inch guns could easily installed on swift merchantn, thus according Great Britain immense superiority by the inversion of liners into auxiliary uisers in war time, because such argument might in the long n, react against American nanal interests, if the United ates should itself decide to delop a merchant marine

There is seemingly no intention the part of the American deletes to accept tht British propos-



al whereby future cruisers would be limited to 7500 tons with 6inch guns. This limitation would be contingent, under the British plan, upon an agreement concerning the number of 10,000-tons cruisers to be allocated to Great Britain, the United States and Japan.


