### DIVIDEND ALLOWED

Dividend payments of 30 per cent on commercial accounts and 50 per cent on savings accounts of the defunct Oregon State Bank of Jefferson were ordered in circuit court yesterday, upon recommendation of Frank C. Bramwell, state superintendent of banks, in charge of liquidation of the institution.

A total of \$24,551.25 is available on commercial deposits aggregating \$81,837.48, while \$19,858.05 is available for savings accounts amounting to \$39,716.09. Claim of the state treasurer for \$4,005.11 against the commercial department has already been paid, it was set out.

Total claims admitted amounted to \$125,558.68, of which sum there will still be \$76,144.27 due depositors.
