NEED ELECTION TO FILL OFFICE DEATH VACATED

the governor to issue his writ of election to fill such vacancy in the same manner and under the same regulations as are prescribed by law to fill vacancies in the legislative assembly.

"The manner of filling vacancies in the legislative assembly is prescribed by section 4026, where, in the governor is required to issue a writ of election directed, in the present instance, to the sheriff of Multnomah county, comprising the third congressional district of the state of Oregon, commanding him to notify the several judges of election in his county comprising said district, to hold a special election to fill such vacancy at a time to be named by the governor in said writ.

"In this connection it may be well to call attention to section 16 of article 5 of the constitution of the state of Oregon, as amended by vote of the people at the general election held November 26, 1906, reading, so far as pertinent, as follows:

"If any vacancy occur in the office of United States senator or in any elective office of the state or of any district, county or precinct thereof, the same shall be filled at the next general election, provided such vacancy occur more than 20 days prior to such general election."

I have noticed in the public press that this provision may be applicable to the condition now

existing. It is noticed, however, that said language does not mention the office of representative in congress, although it does mention the office of United States senator.

"Clearly, this is for the reason that the seventeenth amendment of the United States constitution provides that the legislature of any state may empower the executive thereof to make temporary appointments to fill vacancies in the office of United States senator until the people fill such vacancies by elect, but there is no provision to this effect to the office of congressman.

"It is also a familiar rule of legal construction that where there is one provision of law general in its application which includes or may include a given subject, upon which there is a special provision of law, the special provision will prevail as constituting an exception from the general provision. "That rule is applicable to the provisions of the United States and state constitutions herein quoted, and the one especially relating to the office of member of congress must control."

Governor Patterson was in Burns yesterday and it was impossible to determine when he will call the special election.

confuse his remarks to an explanation of the latest British plan and Mr. Gibson simply to explain why the Americans could not accept the British scheme, if they have definitely decided that they cannot.

According to reliable reports tonight the Americans consider the British plan totally unacceptable and hold the belief that nothing is to be gained by dragging on with negotiations which appear to be forced to failure.

Nevertheless it is believed that a spectacular public session is likely Monday, particularly if the British not only explain their plan but also criticize the demand of the Americans for freedom to build large size cruisers and in a general way seek to put the blame for failure of the conference upon the Americans.

Should this happen, Mr. Gibson

undoubtedly would reply in vigorous terms and it is this argumentative duel which many persons wish to prevent on the ground that it threatens the immediate breaking down of the conference. That caused the efforts today to adjourn the conference to a later date without holding any plenary public session.

Since the plenary session seems inevitable it is likely also that the Japanese will make a statement on that occasion. It is said that they object to certain British proposals, particularly the present plan for retaining obsolete warships and also the clause permitting the transfer of tonnage from one category of warships to another.
