

VALLEY MOTOR CO. WINS CHAMPIONSHIP

One more successful twilight league season went down into history Wednesday evening with the Valley Motor baseball team holding the championship in the Commercial league as the result of an exciting 12 to 4 victory over the Papermakers, the second straight win of a scheduled three game series, and the tenth straight victory that the champions have won.

It was announced that the Valley Motor will play a one-game "little world series" with a picked team from the Industrial league, Friday evening at Oxford Park. Another twilight game is set for this evening, the PEP company meeting the Mountain States Power company team from Albany.

The Ford hostlers did not waste any time sitting away the championship. Dietz, leading off in the first inning, walked and was sacrificed along by Steelhammer. Proctor also drew a walk, and Fabry, who had been in the midst of a hitting slump, suddenly reformed by cracking out a three bagger, scoring Dietz and Proctor.

In the second inning the Papermakers' pitcher, Oudeans, distinguished himself by striking out three batsmen, but in the third the more runs. Proctor was safe on Ford mechanics piling up three runs and Hook singled to left; then Fabry "did it again," this time a homer out of the park.

In the fourth Russell, Valley Motor's dependable pitcher got the first home run of his career, over the left field wall. There was another run in the fifth when Hook walked, advanced on Fabry's infield out, and scampered home from second on Girod's single.

The sixth was a riot, the winners needlessly piling up five more runs on five hits. "Russell 'did his stuff' this time too, starting the rally with a two bagger.

The Papermakers got four runs with a rally of their own in the fourth, but they were all made on two hits, a walk, a fielder's choice with everybody safe, and one error. The next inning Proctor relieved Russell on the mound for the Valley Motor, and held the Papermakers safe, striking out five batsmen in the three innings. Russell also was credited with three strikeouts, and Oudeans with six.
