Pipe Organ for Professor Roberts Home Now on Display

Many are interested in the beautiful new Gunther pipe organ and console which are now on display at the Salem Music Company, 355 North High street. This organ will be installed later in the week in the charming studio-residence of Professor and Mrs. T. S. Roberts, on North Summer Street.

The organ which is sold by the Gunther Company of Portland, is finished in walnut. It has three manuals and a complete set of twenty-five changes. The one thousand pipes, which range from a few inches to fourteen feet in height, will be installed in rooms built for the purpose and will be entirely concealed from view.

Professor Roberts will give a number of musicales later in the season and at that time a complete description of the installed organ will be given.
