

Bayes, Mackie Meet Next Week

MAIN FIGHT EVENT TO GO TEN ROUNDS

Promoter Harry Plant announced last night that Phil Bayes, of Salem, and Ad Mackie, of Portland, have been matched in a ten round main event for the first fall boxing show at the Salem armory Thursday, September 29.

This event will usher in a season of fight cards which will include all others. Matchmaker Plant indicates that he will bring to this city this winter such fighters as Benny Pelz and Willie Gordon if the people want them, and will come out in numbers sufficient to make such a program possible.

In the Bayes-Mackie scrap, Plant believes that he has one entirely in keeping with his plans for a better fight season. Mackie fought Bobby Gray at the armory last spring, earning a decision after he had all but knocked Gray into a pulp. Mackie is a cool, calculating fighter who is always out to win and so dangerous is he that Portland battlers are afraid to take him on.

Hayes, the local champion, has been working out at the armory for the past week and has improved his condition a great deal. He will probably weigh in for the fight at 130 pounds, with Mackie tipping the scales at 129. Bayes improves his skill with every card, and is anxious to advance his reputation throughout the northwest still more by a nod over Mackie.

The fact that the winner probably will be matched with Benny Pelz two weeks later will be a still greater incentive for the two men to go at it Thursday night in a real battle.

Stanley Frye, local boxing instructor, at one time champion of the Pacific fleet, will serve as referee at this fight, and for the rest of the season. A card will be staged every other Wednesday night for the remainder of the winter.

Preliminary bouts for the card Thursday, which will be Portland day at the state fair, have not yet been arranged. Plant did not know until yesterday that there would be a card so early.
