THE FUNERAL OF WALTER L. TOOZE

Will Be Held at Elks Club This Forenoon; Interment To Be At Eugene

The funeral services for Walter L. Tooze, who passed away in Salem on Wednesday evening, is to be held at the Elks club at 10:30 this forenoon. The remains will then be taken by auto to Eugene for interment in the Odd Fellows' cemetery there, by the side of his son, Lieut. Leslie Tooze, who was killed on the firing line in the Argentine forest nine years to the day before the death of his father. The services at the grave will be private. The Eugene Elks will have charge there.

At the funeral at the Elks club the eulogy will be given by Senator Gus Moser of Portland, so long associated with Mr. Tooze in the upper house of the Oregon legislature, where the latter was reading clerk. The music will be by the Salem Elks quartette.

OPERATION UNUSUAL

Piece of Leg Bone Replaces Broken Vertebrae

A most remarkable operation, if it turns out successfully, and which the next few days will tell—was performed yesterday afternoon at the Salem hospital by Dr. George Vehrs on the spinal column of Wallace Burnett, of Pendleton. Burnett is suffering with a broken neck, received five days ago when he ran into a mule near Pendleton while going at a terrific speed on his motorcycle.

It was found that two of the main vertebrae just between the neck and shoulders, were badly smashed. The operation was performed entirely by means of local anesthetic. A second operation was performed on the patient's leg, also by local anesthetic, from

which a piece of bone was cut out and grafted into the column to replace the broken vertebrae taken out.

The spinal cord was found to be seriously injured, but pieces of broken vertebrae with edges were passing through against it and in time would have severed it. The patient is cast from his hips up, unable to move a muscle from his neck down, but is in perfect use of mental faculties.
