LOS ANGELES, Oct. 12.—(AP) -The American Federation of Labor went on record as affirming the Monroe doctrine when its national convention today condemnd a resolution which opposed the pterference of the United States military forces in the affairs of other countries.

The defeated resolution, which had expressed opposition to what it described as the imperialistic policy of the United States, and to he country's sending troops and ships to China, was condemned in the report of the resolutions committee as having no regard for the truth.
