Governor's Private Secretary Criticized

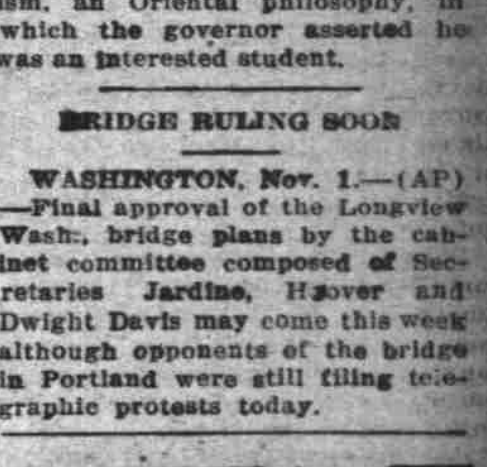
