

BARHAM BROTHERS PREDICT ACTIVITY

Will Change Name of Their Building Organization January First

The Cherry City Construction company announce that January 1st the name of the concern will be changed to Barham Brothers Construction company. The firm, organized three years ago, consists of four brothers, J. A. Barham, W. J. Barham, E. V. Barham and Wayne W. Barham, all well known and popular in the capital city.

The Barham brothers for many years have been closely identified with construction work throughout the Willamette valley. Their first work of importance was just 17 years ago, when they were the successful bidders on the First National bank at Newberg. They also built the Falls City school house the same year.

In recent years they have constructed numerous residences and other buildings throughout the valley, including the boys' and girls' club building and the auto pavilion at the state fairgrounds; also the \$18,000 annex to the institution for the feeble minded and the annex to the tuberculosis hospital. They are now completing the McLoughlin church at Independence.

W. J. Barham, one of the brothers, stated last night that there seems to be no decrease in the demand for first class homes, and that the prevailing prices on building materials, especially on lumber, is giving an added spurt to the interest in home building. He sees no cause for predicting anything but continued building activity in Salem and vicinity throughout the coming year.

EUGENE, Dec. 12.—(AP)—That rarest of rare events, a double knockout, featured the scheduled two hour wrestling show which Wildcat Pete, junior middleweight of Eugene, won from Merle Christenson of Albany, on

two out of three falls. Christenson won the first fall in 22 minutes and Pete the second on an airplane spin 17 minutes later. Both wrestlers crashed to the mat for the third fall, their heads striking together as they did so and both were knocked cold. Pete happened to fall on top and was awarded the fall and the decision.

A Salem district meeting of Methodist church ministers was held last Monday at Amity. The all-day meeting was called by Superintendent D. H. Leech. More than thirty ministers were presented. MEXICO STAND OUTLINED

No Objection to Elias Testifying as Individual, Word

MEXICO CITY, Dec. 12.—(AP)—The Mexican government has no objection to the Mexican consul general, Arturo M. Elias, giving the senate committee in Washington such information as he personally voluntarily pleases. Acting Foreign Minister Estrada announced in an official statement today. But, he added, the only Mexican official in the United States who is authorized to receive requests for official information is the Mexican ambassador.

"If Consul General Elias," says the statement, "desires voluntarily to give the senate committee the information asked of him, and do it in a personal manner, it will not be the Mexican government that will object to greater light being thrown upon the scandalous calumnies. The only representative of Mexico empowered to receive requests for official information from the American authorities and through the proper channels is our ambassador at Washington.
