AWARDED \$10,000 BAIL

Mrs. Mary Kelly Given Verdict Tenth of that Asked

WALLA WALLA, Wash., Dec. 15.—(AP).—A jury last night awarded \$10,000 to Mrs. Mary Kelly, who was suing George Drumheller, nationally known race horse man for \$100,000 for breach of promise. The jury took the case into the afternoon and returned the verdict at 9:55.

Charges that Drumheller, wealthy race horse and wheat man, kept Mrs. Mary Kelly in virtual "slavery" on his ranch "until wrinkles began to appear on her face," and then cast her away, were made by attorneys for the plaintiff in superior court here today.

Counsel for Drumheller flung back the accusation that Mrs. Kelly was trying to gouge the turfman, and stated that none of the letters read in court indicated that he had promised to marry her.

LINDY'S MILEAGE 35,000

Hop To Mexico City Adds 2000 Miles To Long Record

NEW YORK, Dec. 15.—(AP)—Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh in completing his 2,000 mile flight to Mexico City, has flown approximately 35,000 miles since he left San Diego, Cal., last May, to start his flight from New York to Paris.

His total flying mileage to date would take him almost one and one half times around the world, if he followed the equatorial circumference of the earth, which is 24,896 miles.

The lone eagle's flights since last May were:
San Diego to St. Louis, 1,550 miles.

St. Louis to New York, 950 miles.
New York to Paris, 3,625 miles. Short hops in Europe, 430 miles.

Flights between New York, Washington, St. Louis, Ottawa, and other cities on his return to the United States, estimated 4,000 miles.

Three months tour of the country in the interests of aviation, 22,850 miles.
Washington to Mexico City, 2,000 miles.
Total 34,905 miles.

QUEBEC FIRE KILLS 50

Young Children Lost When Flames Take Orphanage

QUEBEC, Dec. 15.—(AP)—Between 35 and 50 children, ranging from five to 16 years of age, are believed to have lost their lives when fire swept the Hospice St. Charles, an orphanage, tonight.

Because of the confusion it was impossible to obtain authentic information as to the number of missing or the names of the victims.

The building was entirely destroyed and the search for the missing was handicapped by the smouldering ruins. Many injured

were taken to hospitals. Although most of the inmates of the institution were orphans, a considerable number of other children were being educated at the hospice.
