The evening was spent playing cards.

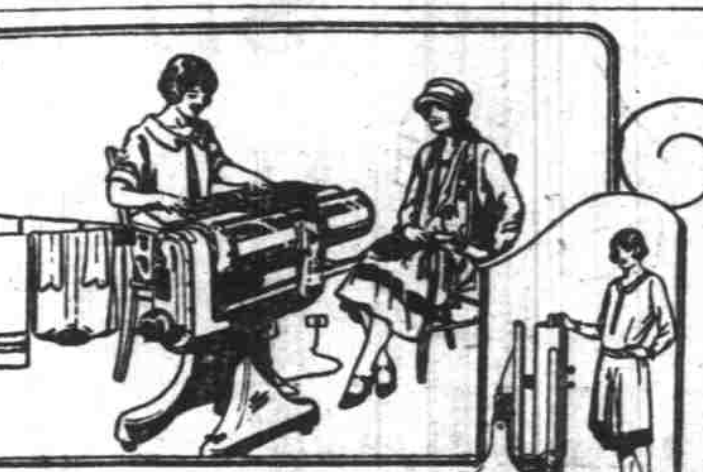

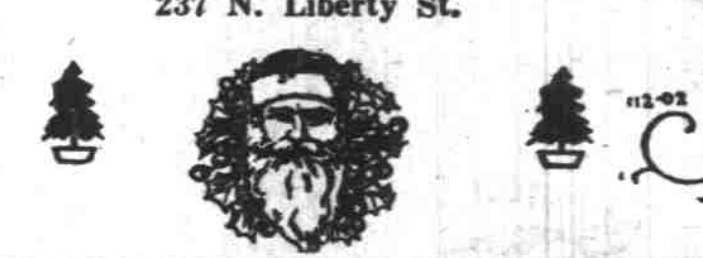
