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**TRUTH IN PLEASANT RHYMES BY RIGDON**

A 200 Page Book Just Off the Press By This Well Known Salem Author

"Truth in Pleasant Rhymes" is the title of a 200 page book, by Winfield Taylor Rigdon, better known by the people of Salem and most of the rest of Oregon as W. T. Rigdon, and to his intimates as Taylor Rigdon. There is a "proem," or explanatory or introductory poem, the first and last verses reading: "I sing the music of the birds That rings in every verdant grove; I voice the lowing of the herds; I catch the meaning of their words As o'er the hills and plains in search of food they rove.

And now, this book I recommend to the aged and the youth; When studying, well, its aim and trend, They'll find the author did intend To lay his richest gifts upon the shrine of TRUTH."

In Three Parts The collection of poems, some of them published heretofore in newspapers and magazines and booklets, are divided into three parts: under three headings. There are poems on the World war, fraternal and miscellaneous poems, and religious and sentimental poems. The volume makes up a worthy contribution by a Salem man who has done much for the city in various practical and patriotic ways, and the wonder is that he has found time in a very busy life to turn off such a volume of work. The book is to be found on sale at the book stores and will no doubt have a ready and a steady sale, for it touches many phases of life and local interest, not the least being the themes relating to pioneer experiences and remembrances; for Mr. Rigdon is a pioneer in the Oregon country, by way of the Oregon Trail, 1850.
