HAZARD IN RESCUE WORK
 Death Barely Missed by Dozen Sailors After Submarine

NEW YORK, Dec. 20.—(AP)—Twelve seamen narrowly escaped death in the icy waters of Long Island sound Monday when heavy seas capsized two small boats in which they were attempting to salvage a pontoon which had broken loose from the naval tug Iuka on its way to the place of the sinking of the submarine S-4.

The twelve struggled ashore through the heavy surf and were taken to the coast guard station at Rocky Point, five miles away.

BULL WILD IN STREETS

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 20.—(AP)—Six persons were hurt and thousands of shoppers terror-stricken by a bull which ran wild through the downtown streets for half an hour until it was shot and killed by a policeman.
 The bull, a huge animal with 10 inch horns, broke from a crate on a truck parked in one of the city's busiest streets and went on a rampage that covered a dozen blocks and left pedestrians sprawling.
 Maddened by shots cautiously fired by policemen as it reared and plunged through scattering men, women and children, the animal finally crashed through a plate glass window and was killed by five shots from the pistol of Corporal Fairstein.
