## ENGLISH PRAYER BOOK PUBLISHED

REVISED VOLUME GIVEN OUT FOR FIRST TIME

Episode Adds Controversial Fuel To Flames of Strife Over Union of Two Churches

LONDON, Jan. 20.—(AP)—Another move in the religious strife featuring the life of England at present was made today with publication of the newly revised prayer book of the Church of England which will be submitted to the church assembly on February 6. It ratified by the church assembly, the book will again go to the house of commons where on December 15 after one of the most dramatic debates in modern times parliament rejected the version upon which the church authorities had labored twenty years.

## AUTO DISCOVERED THOUGHT BANDITS'

All Fingerprints Obliterated; Loaded Rifle Found Inside Car

PORTLAND, Jan. 20.—(AP)—The discovery here of an automobile abandoned by one or more of a gang of bank robbers after two of the gang had fallen victims of the deadly rifle fire of the cashier of the bank they had intended to rob, failed today to add further information to police who are attempting to run down others of the bandit group. It is the belief of police that at least two men escaped.

Two others, John Benton, 22, and Albert Anderson, 22, alias Fred Williams, were shot to death by A. J. Demorest, cashier of the suburban Mt. Scott bank, as with automatic pistols in hand they threatened the employees of the bank and demanded the funds of the institution. The shooting took place soon after opening hour yesterday.

The abandoned automobile was found in an alley today covered with frost and sleet. Police said all fingerprints had been obliterated by the weather. A fully loaded rifle was found in the machine, which police have definitely established as the one in which the bandits fled.

Several residents of the neighborhood in which the car was found said they saw a man leave the car and run away shortly after the attempted holdup. The man was about five feet five inches tall and wore a dark overcoat and cap.

## BURNS LOSES TILT

WASHINGTON, Jan. 20.—(AP)—The government won at least a temporary victory today in the contempt case of Harry F. Sinclair, William J. Burns and their four associates.

Over defense objections Justice Frederick L. Siddons permitted Gardner P. Siddons, one of the jurors shadowed by Burns detectives, subject to a motion to strike from the record, to tell of inaccuracies in some reports about his movements. The prosecution has sought in this way to uphold its charge that the real purpose of the surveillance was to concoct false charges against the jurors and bring about a mistrial of the oil case.

Martin W. Littleton, counsel for Sinclair, today issued a statement assailing Senator Norris of Nebraska, who has taken issue with Justice Siddons' conduct of the case.

"Senator Norris keeping carefully within the senatorial walls of privileges commits a flagrant and unmitigated contempt of court from which he is saved by an immunity without which he would not have spoken," he said. "It is a shameful effort to intimidate a judge in the decision of a case."
