CHILD HEALTH WORK HERE GIVEN PRAISE

Barry Smith, Director of Commonwealth Fund, Reviews Progress

Results of the Marion county child health demonstration work during the first half of the five year period have been satisfactory and encouraging, says Barry Smith, director of the Commonwealth Fund who is in the city inspecting the work.
He anticipates still greater progress in the establishment of a well rounded public health program during the remaining time of the demonstration until its close, July 1, 1930.
"While the departure of Dr. Walter H. Brown was a loss, Dr. De Kleine, who has succeeded him, has had wide and long experience in public health and will prove an able and worthy successor," said Mr. Smith.
While Mr. Smith has not had opportunity to meet many of the Marion county people who are interested in the demonstration, both he and Miss Quin, assistant director of the fund, who has been here ten days, are much impressed by the support given the work and Mr. Smith expressed especial pleasure at the cordial cooperation of the medical profession. All the fund's demonstrations have enjoyed this but Mr. Smith believes it is especially marked in Marion county.
The Commonwealth fund was organized in 1918 with an endowment of approximately \$38,000,000 given by the late Mrs. Stephen Harkness who died two years ago. The fund employs directly or indirectly about 300 persons, chiefly in public health, mental hygiene, and education.
The fund is interested primarily in six general projects. They are as follows:
(1) Four child health demonstrations.
(2) Mental hygiene clinics for children. The fund has had 10 demonstrations of this work, at Los Angeles, St. Louis, St. Paul, Minneapolis, Dallas, Cleveland, Philadelphia, Richmond, and Norfolk. All were successful except at Norfolk. The fund is now operating a mental hygiene training clinic in New York called the "Institute of Child Guidance," with a budget of \$175,000.
(3) The fund has promoted establishment of visiting teaching in the public schools in some fifty communities in the United States.

Valselt School Closed By Scarlet Fever Cases

OREGON NORMAL SCHOOL, Monmouth, Jan. 20.—(Special)—School at Valselt was closed at noon Thursday and three families were quarantined for scarlet fever by order of the county health officer, Dr. A. B. Starbuck of Dallas. If no additional cases are reported within the coming week, school will reopen. A small son in the family of D. A. Grout, chairman of the Valselt school board, is seriously ill with the disease.
