### Legs Straightened Life Put in Danger CHICAGO, Feb. 1.—(AP)—A wish for straight legs has cost Miss Sadie Holland, 30, stenographer, the limbs which were slightly bowed and tonight her life was in danger.

### Two weeks ago Dr. Henry J. Schireson, plastic surgeon, operated upon the young woman's legs. A week ago Dr. William Van Doren, the Holland family physician was called by Miss Holland's parents. There last Friday Dr. Paul Magnuson amputated both legs above the knees.
