ONWARD CHRISTIAN SOLDIERS

Rev. Sabine Baring-Gould, 1834-1924
"Onward, Christian Soldiers,
Marching as to war,
With the cross of Jesus
Going on before."

This hymn, eminently a Sunday school marching tune, was always a favorite of Theodore Roosevelt and during his last campaign for the presidency, he frequently had it sung at his meetings, for he invited the people to "come to Armageddon and battle for the Lord."

The author, Baring-Gould, wrote the hymn as a processional for his own English parish, Lew-Trenchard, England, striking it off in a few minutes, as if by inspiration. On Whitsuntide, the children of his parish joined St. Peter's school and paraded to quaint old Horbury, involving a steep climb of more than a mile. To maintain order and to put life into the climb, Rev. Baring-Gould wrote the hymn, which has since gone all over the world and is one of the most popular of all the martial church hymns.

On the occasion of a church processional, the Bishop of Ripon noticed a banner with a cross on it, and, disliking the idea of using the sacred sign in this way, he requested that it be removed. The rector of the church anxiously said, "My Lord, we are about to sing as a processional 'Onward Christian Soldiers.' Shall we alter the last lines to read, 'With the cross of Jesus left behind the door?'" "Substitute another hymn," the Bishop replied, and they did so.

When the verses had been written for the hymn, Sir Arthur Sullivan, who became famous for the world over for the Gilbert and Sullivan operas, such as "Pinafore," "Pirates of Penzance" and "The Mikado," composed a tune which just suited Rev. Baring-Gould. The combination of the inspiring words and the martial air assured fame for the hymn. It is irresistible in its inspiring influence over a crowd, whether in band march or congregational worship.

Rev. Baring-Gould was born at Exeter, England, January 28, 1834 and was the eldest son of Edward Baring-Gould. He was graduated at Clare College, Oxford, in 1856. After spending a few years in the ministry, he was appointed to Lew-Trenchard, the seat of his own family three hundred years.
