Capitol Theater

Jack Holt and Dorothy Revier met for the first time during the making of Columbia Pictures' production, "The Tigress," which will be shown at the Capitol theater today. Five minutes after they had been introduced by Director George B. Seitz, Jack had Dorothy in his arms and was raining kisses upon her face.

Elsinore Theater

This is something to write home about.

The internationally-known Zane Grey's latest picture is secured for a four-day "run" at the Elsinore.

It will be shown to packed houses on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

"Under the Tonto Rim," a western picture done as only the author can do it, deals with gold.

For his theme Grey has gone back to about 1880, when the cry of the precious metal roused the sleepy little cattle center of Tonto Basin, in Arizona, to riotous activity.

There is action—plenty of it—just as might be expected from the pen of Grey.

Richard Arlen is the lead. His father, luckily, finds gold nearby. In town Arlen meets Mary Brian, sister of Jack Luden, who is the government recorder.

There is no dull moment in the picture—even for those who do not care for "Westerns."

Furthermore there is nothing "cheap" about the picture. The directing is excellent, regularly due to the fact that Grey would not permit one of his novels to be mangled up through inferior acting and direction.

LLOYD HAHN FAILS TO SET NEW MARK

NEW YORK, Feb. 13.—(AP)—Lloyd Hahn, American middle distance ace, failed tonight in an attempt to beat the world's record for the two thirds of a mile.

Finishing the last four laps of the race alone, Hahn covered the distance in 2 minutes 44.25 seconds, compared with the world's record of 2:43.35, held by Jimmy Connolly of the New York A. C. Connolly's mark was set five years ago.

Although he failed to beat Connolly's record, Hahn, running on a smooth board floor with unbanked turns, tied the world's best outdoor time for the distance set in 1916 at Newark, N. J., by Melvin W. Sheppard, old Olympic hero.

Water Company May Move Central Offices to Salem

Salem may become the central office headquarters of the Oregon-Washington water service company, for which the present building facilities would be doubled.

The company at present has a three-year lease on Portland property but when the lease is up it is planned to move the general offices here, as Salem is the logical center of present activities of the company.

The Federal water service company of New York, of which the Oregon-Washington concern is a subsidiary, was organized in 1926, one of six major holding companies, Mr. Helwick stated. It is the largest of the group and the first to become national in scope.
