Onions Will Be Stronger

Local wholesalers report considerable excitement in the onion market the last few days, and if present conditions continue it will only be a matter of a few days before onions reach the high water price of 5 cents a pound. In fact, they predict the 5 cent mark almost a certainty.

All grades of dry onions have advanced, prices late yesterday showing the growers demanding from \$3.50 to \$4 per hundred pound sack, with loading extra to the shipping point.

Unlike the mature onion, sets have taken a different trend this week and a marked weakened condition is the present market situation, prices being from \$4.50 to \$5.25 per hundred.

Green onions from The Dalles are quoted at 60 cents per dozen bunches, although the supply is very limited now.

Fruit Price Fluctuating

Some fluctuations have been noted in the fruit market this week, the following being reported from the Salem wholesalers:

Prices on bananas are holding moderately firm this week, with the market situation much the same as last week.

Trade demand for limes is very slow. They wholesale at \$2.75 a carton.

Lemons are not quite so firm this week as last, the supply now being more in accord with de-
