showing a stronger trend, prices ranging 50 cents a hundred higher over last week. Wholesalers are quoting a price of from \$2.75 to \$3.50 per hundred pounds on the following varieties: Early Rose, Early Ohio, Earliest of All, Beauty Hebron, Bliss Triumph, American Wonder and Irish Cobbler. Activity in Vegetables Market Increasing Fast

Activity in the fruit and vegetable markets has been more pronounced this week than for some time, with prices on many commodities taking a change for the higher or lower. Latest quotations and market conditions are furnished by local wholesalers as given below on vegetables and those lines that are not accounted for elsewhere in the market section:
A few California cellar stock sweet potatoes are still available at 7 cents per pound. Southern sweets continue plentiful, selling prices remaining the same as last week.
Brussels sprouts from around Portland are more plentiful now, but market conditions are in a rather undecided frame of mind.
Artichokes of excellent quality may be had at from \$1.26 to \$1.65, according to size.
Florida fancy egg plant is available at 30 cents a pound.
The rhubarb market is showing a stronger trend, with prices approximately 25 cents per box higher than last week.
Hot house cucumbers are coming in in limited numbers, grades being choice and extra fancy. The latter is quoted at \$4.50, prices ranging to as low as \$3.50 on the standards.
Mexican tomatoes are coming in better numbers, a lug of 30 pounds of fine quality fruits being quoted at from \$5 to \$5.75.
There is a limited supply of Hubbard squash from Marblehead, Calif., at from \$4.50 to \$5. Keeping qualities are not so good this time of year.
Florida peppers never looked better than right now, for shape, size, and keeping qualities. There is a slight weakening in the market, with the usual price being 20 cents a pound.
There is still a little flicker of the local cabbage, though probably another week will see the end of it. It is being replaced by Flat Dutch and Winningstadt varieties from California, wholesale

Asparagus Coming In

Wholesalers report the first shipments of asparagus from the Sacramento region this week. Quality is good, nice green bunches selling at 50 cents a pound wholesale. Asparagus will shortly be making its appearance on the local markets.
The distributing houses also report the best strawberries are coming from Florida, at a price of 90 cents per quart. A few berries are coming in pint cups from Mt. Signal, Calif., at about 50 cents each. There has been no demand for them, either, among the local merchants as yet.

Spinach from California is bringing \$2@2.50 per crate. Some Oregon stock is offered but most of it is showing attractive quality. Broccoli is slightly weaker with more of the number on stock moving around \$1.50 per crate.

Roseburg broccoli continues to hold the market at about 10 to 15 cents per crate raise over last week. Broccoli is putting in an appearance from Colma, Calif., with laid-in prices approximately the same as the southern Oregon crop. With moderate weather forecasted for the next few days, it is anticipated the Roseburg broccoli will shortly hit an easier trend.
California bunch vegetables are unchanged from last week.
The garlic market is stronger, with best grades at 15 cents a pound. Horseradish roots, the new stock, is quoted at 25 cents per pound.
The California lettuce market is somewhat wild, with the general trend in prices 25 cents per crate higher than last week. The fourteen size crate now commands a premium of 25 cents. Wholesalers are asking from \$3.25 to \$3.75 for the more desirable size.
California or Chula Vista celery is commanding \$6.50 to \$7 crate, the supply being good and quality now excellent.
A few new crops have been added to list of California root vegetables, notably turnips and beets. Prices on the southern state's root crops are \$3.50 to \$4 per cwt.
Walla Walla has been shipping an excellent hothouse radish the past week, but according to latest reports at the wholesale houses the supply is already nearly exhausted, with the few remaining bringing a premium of 10 cents per dozen bunches over last week's quotation.
