ERIOUS DISEASES NOT SO PREVALENT

Measles Principal Item On Month's Report; Births Reach 95 Total

With the exception of measles fever and tuberculosis ommunicable diseases in Marion ounty for February showed a derease over the same month of last ear, according to the report of r. Vernon A. Douglas, county ealth officer. The report was preented at the meeting of the exeutive committee of the Marion ounty health unit Saturday noon. Present were Judge John Siegmund, Frank Neer, T. M. Hicks, Dr. William DeKleine, and the health officer.

A decided jump was noticeable in the cases of measles reported. a total of 216 as compared to 3 for February, 1927. One reason for the large numbers of measles cases reported was the cooperation of parents in notifying the health officer when measles appeared in the home, and also the reports of local physicians, the officer's report states.

There was one more case of scarlet fever last month than in February 1927, and the 11 cases of tuberculosis meant an increase of

Only two cases of diphtheria were reported last month, as compared with six during the corresponding period of 1927. The decrease in this disease has been noticed consistently through the months of 1927 and up to February 1928.

Largest decrease in the two months' figures was noted in influenza, with 41 cases in February, 1927, and none last month. Whooping cough fell off from 17 cases in 1927 to only 2 in February of this year. There was no typhoid fever last month, and 9 cases a year ago.

Other diseases and cases reported last month are: small pox. 1: pneumonia, 2; erysipelas, 2; gonorrhea, 1; mumps, 3; meningitis. 2; chickenpox, 17.

Vital statistics recorded by the health officer for February show 80 deaths for the month, a decrease of 16 over the previous month and 5 less than February. 1927. Causes of deaths were: 31. diseases of heart and blood vessels; 11 diseases of nervous system. 6 cancer, 4 kidney disorders; 12 communicable diseases, including 6 tuberculosis, 3 pneumonia, and 2 meningitis.

February births reached the un-February, 1928. For the month of he report, births succeeded deaths by 15, while in January deaths were greater by 17. Forty of the February babies were males; parents of 36 make their homes in




