"Abide with me; fast falls the eventide; The darkness deepens; Lord, with me abide: When other helpers fail, and comforts flee, Help of the helpless, O abide with me."

California Fight Growing Warmer State Has Now Become "Battleground of Nation" Is Declaration OAKLAND, Cal., March 22.—(AP)—The declaration that "California has become the political battleground of the nation" was made today in a statement issued by John P. Holland, treasurer of the Walsh-for-president campaign committee, to the California state national convention.

Wet republicans throughout the state are registering in large numbers as democrats in order to vote for Governor Al Smith at the May primaries. The situation is serious. Unless met and offset within the next seven days by independent republican drags demanding their affiliation to the democratic party, the Walsh-dry-progressive-anti-Tammany - Woodrow Wilson ticket will be placed in grave jeopardy.

If McDoo's home state is lost, the backbone of the dry-progressive organization is broken and Smith's nomination is all but assured. If contrary, California is carried by the Walsh-Woodrow Wilson ticket, as we have every right to expect, the nomination of Tammany Hall's candidate for the presidency will be as impossible as it is now unthinkable.
