

Attorneys indicated that the suit was brought primarily to keep the registration books open until 30 days prior to the primary election, and that the merger merely was incidental to the proceeding. It was contended that in case the registration books remain closed until after the special election a large number of voters would be deprived of the privilege of registering for the primary election. 
