

CALL TO DUTY MADE ON WAR ANNIVERSARY

Universal Draft Measure Should Have Support As Peace Possibility

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., April 7.—A call to duty by the national commander of the American Legion, Edward E. Spafford, to every citizen of the United States, for the insurance of permanent peace by supporting the universal draft measure now before congress was made public at national headquarters here in commemoration of the anniversary of America's entry into the World War, April 6, 1917. The national commander today is scheduled to be in Ogden, Utah, on an airplane flight through 14 states.

The message reads: "This day we should look back toward eleven years when our country faced the greatest crisis in our history, and every state was mobilizing its youth to meet it. Our young men were drawn into the bloodiest conflict the world has yet experienced. They served with sacrifice and suffering in the trenches and on battle fields. They did their full duty.

"We now have another duty, just as urgent and too long delayed, to perform.

"We must keep faith with those young men who carried the heaviest burdens and died that we might enjoy the blessings of this country in peace. We can keep that faith by helping safeguard the future with a permanent insurance against war. We can help make it impossible for some people to shout for war, then, refusing to go, throw their efforts into business and make huge profits.

"There is no better way of keeping faith than by enacting the universal draft law. It should be done at the present session of congress. This law will insure equal service for all, profits for none, without expense to maintain and will do more toward making other nations avoid confronting us with the necessity of going into war than anything else that can be devised.

"It is the personal duty of every citizen now to become familiar with the universal draft, the Capper-Johnson bill, H. R. 3313 and S. 1283. It is the duty of every citizen to understand how the universal draft will protect our children of tomorrow against slackers and profiteers if war comes, and, most important, will prevent war by seeing that there is no one in this country who can profit while others fight for them.

"Do you know the history of how the lack of this legislation cost our country countless lives and treasures in all of our wars of the past? Do you know that twenty thousand new millionaires were created in the last war while the young men of our country were serving for \$1.10 a day? Will you not make it a personal duty to become familiar with the great advancement for permanent peace that this universal draft legislation will make possible. Ask a Legion post about it. And if you believe in doing everything possible to bring about peace for all time, will you not lend your force in support of it—for your sake, for the sake of your children and for those who have died for us?"

HAYS STARTS SUIT

DISLIKES BEING CALLED CZAR OF MOVIES

NEW YORK, Apr. 7.—(AP)—Will H. Hays took exception to being called czar of the movies in answer to a suit filed in court today.

Mr. Hays who is at present in France on business as head of the motion picture producers and distributors of America, denied in the court paper that he is the supreme authority in the movies but acknowledged that his advice is valued in the industry.

The paper was an answer to a suit by Valeska Suratt in which the scenario writer mentions Hays as one of many individuals and corporations she charges stole the plot of "The King of Kings" from her and in which she refers to Hays as the czar of the picture industry.

Miss Suratt in her complaint says that she submitted a manuscript to Hays and that after praising it he gave it to Cecil De Mille. De Mille, she says, returned the manuscript to her and shortly afterwards "The King of Kings" appeared, identical with her scenario.

WEST POINT, N. Y., April 7.—(AP)—Tom Jenkins, the famous

old professional wrestler, not only is far from being dead but ready to demonstrate it for the benefit of anybody in general and particularly William A. Brady, under whose name an article in this week's issue of Liberty magazine describing a match at Cleveland between Jenkins and Yousef, the "terrible Turk" says: "Jenkins never recovered. He suffered severe injuries that indirectly caused his death some years later."

This match was staged some 30 years ago. Jenkins, now an instructor at the United States military academy, is still able to take care of himself in grappling with his young cadet pupils. To show his interviewer today that the reports of his death are "greatly exaggerated," he playfully awished the correspondent by the neck.

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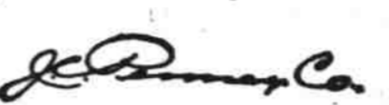
