Glenna Improves, Passes 3rd Round

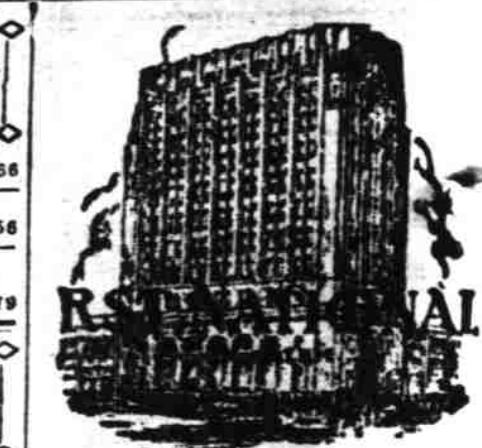
