

# Senators Strengthened for Crucial Game With Bend Here on Sunday

## LYLE BIGBEE SIGNS ALSO TWO OTHERS

With the hardest home game of the season looming up for Sunday when the Bend Eagles invade Salem, Manager Leo Edwards of the Senators yesterday took steps to strengthen his club, particularly in the hitting department, by signing up Lyle Bigbee, former University of Oregon all round athlete who has been playing in organized ball for the last few seasons. This year he has been with Bend, but for some reason which had nothing to do with his playing ability was released this week and signed by Edwards.

Champ Vaughn of Corvallis will be another addition to the Senator

batting order Sunday. Both of these men are outfielders, but just which positions they will fill has not been settled.

A third recruit Sunday will be Harold Hawk, who played third base for the Senators the latter part of last season and was liked for his hitting and fielding ability but mostly because he was a hustler. He probably will not break into Sunday's game unless as a pinch hitter.

The league directors held a meeting at Albany last night, but no important action was taken, other than a decision to take drastic steps should any team in the future walk off the field as the Bend team did at Albany last Sunday.

The postponed Bend-Eugene game at Eugene will probably be played in connection with a three day rodeo at Eugene July 2, 3 and 4.

Speaking of holiday games, the Senators have signed up Montavilla, the team that gave the locals so much trouble in their efforts to win the Portland City league title, for Memorial day, next Wednesday. This is practically the same team that was runner-up in the second half of last season's play, and is now among the leaders in that league again.

## SHARKEY SIGNS UP TO FIGHT JUNE 20

NEW YORK, May 24.—(AP)—Jack Sharkey, Boston heavyweight, has agreed to terms through his manager for a match in July, with the winner of the Johnny Risko-George Godfrey battle at Ebbets field June 20, Humbert J. Fugazy announced today. The contracts will be signed Monday.

Sharkey, who scored a sensational one round knockout over Jack Delaney, recently to regain some of the prestige he lost last winter, is the second major heavyweight to forsake Tex Rickard for his metropolitan rival, Fugazy. Risko went over to the Brooklyn promoter when Tom Heeney was named winner of the heavyweight elimination tournament and signed for a title match with Gene Tunney.

Both Risko and Godfrey have agreed to fight Sharkey, Fugazy said. His signing of Tommy Loughran, light heavyweight champion for bouts at Ebbets field against Pete Latzo next Wednesday and Leo Lomski June 13 drew a threat from Rickard to air the question of the right to Loughran's services in court.

## ANDREW PAYNE INCREASES LEAD

SUFFERN, N. Y., May 24.—(AP)—Although he finished far in the ruck on the 35 mile lap from Middletown, N. Y. Andrew Payne of Claremore, Okla., increased his lead over the Passaic, N. J. Finn, Jon Salo, his closest competitor in C. C. Pyle's transcontinental foot race today.

Tied for 19th place with Phillip Granville, Hamilton, Ont., Payne coasted into the 82nd control point in 8 hours 24 minutes 49 seconds, bringing his elapsed time for the 3,365.4 miles from Los Angeles to 564:32:36. Salo jogged into Suffern in 8:28:28 giving him 21st place on the lap. Salo's total elapsed time is 582:04:42, giving Payne a lead of 17:36:6. Granville holds third place in the standings.

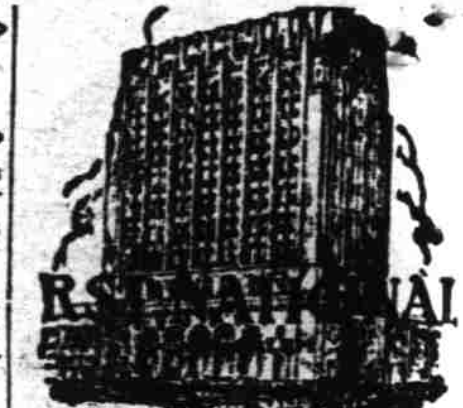

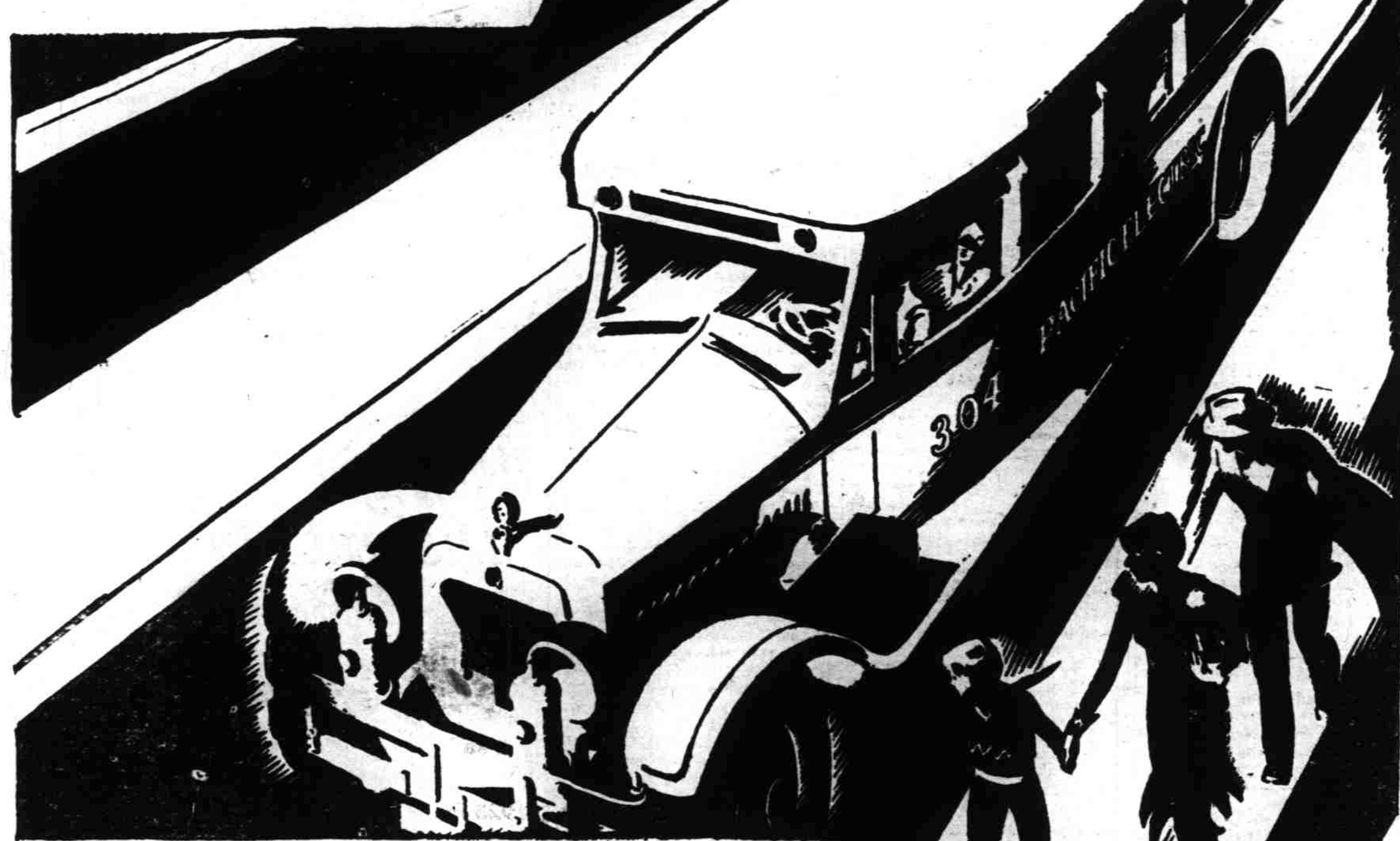
