OREGON NINE ENDS SUCCESSFUL YEAR

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, June 5.—(Special).—The University of Oregon baseball team, champion of the northern section of the Pacific Coast conference, disbanded this week after ending its most successful season in history.
